


# **Integrated Epidemiologic Profile of HIV/AIDS, Georgia, 2011**

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## ***Introduction***

The 2011 HIV/AIDS Integrated Epidemiologic Profile describes the overall scope of the HIV/AIDS epidemic in Georgia. It is intended as a preliminary resource to guide HIV/AIDS planning and prevention activities. This brief profile describes the demographics of the state, persons living with HIV/AIDS, persons with AIDS who have died, persons with HIV/AIDS and STD co-infections, and the behaviors of those who are at risk for HIV/AIDS. Data were obtained from multiple sources to address these questions:

- 1) What are the socio-demographic characteristics of the overall population in Georgia?
- 2) What is the scope of the HIV/AIDS epidemic in Georgia?
- 3) What are the indicators of risk for HIV/AIDS in Georgia?
- 4) What are the indicators of risk for HIV/AIDS and STD co-infections in Georgia?
- 5) What are the indicators of risk for HIV/AIDS and TB co-infections in Georgia?

## ***Executive Summary***

HIV/AIDS remains an important public health problem in Georgia. In 2009, Georgia had one of the highest rates of persons living with a diagnosis of HIV infection in the United States at 32.9 per 100,000 persons<sup>1</sup>. The Atlanta MSA comprised more than 50% of the state population in 2010 and had the highest

percentage of people living with HIV/AIDS in the state (66%).

From 2001 to 2010, 71% of new HIV/AIDS diagnoses in Georgia occurred among males. Seventy-four percent of new HIV/AIDS diagnoses were among Black, non-Hispanics. Among Black, non-Hispanics, those in the age group of 30-39 years had the highest rate of new HIV/AIDS diagnoses.

The HIV/AIDS epidemic in Georgia is primarily driven by sexual exposure, especially among men who have sex with men and high risk heterosexuals. Injection drug use is also a high risk category, but less prevalent than sexual contact.

Communicable diseases like STDs and TB pose a risk for individuals who are infected with HIV in Georgia. STDs can increase the risk for HIV infection from 2 to 5 times.<sup>2</sup> For example, syphilis leads to decreased CD4 T-cell counts and increased plasma viral load in patients chronically infected with HIV, and this has been linked to increased HIV transmission.<sup>3</sup> Equally important, TB is a leading cause of morbidity and mortality for people with HIV/AIDS.<sup>4</sup> People who are co-infected with HIV and TB are at an increased risk of reactivation of latent TB and acquisition of new opportunistic infections.<sup>5</sup>

Although some states began name-based HIV/AIDS reporting in the early 1980s, Georgia did not initiate name-based HIV reporting until December 31, 2003. In Georgia, we documented a peak in new HIV-NA diagnoses in 2004 but an overall decline in new HIV-NA diagnoses from 2005 to 2009. Crude

rates for the number of people newly diagnosed with HIV/AIDS and the number of people living with HIV/AIDS are used in this report, so caution should be used when interpreting data.

Additionally, as a result of delayed and incomplete reporting, the *actual* number of HIV/AIDS cases may not be reflected in the *reported* number of cases within the diagnosis year.

### ***HIV/AIDS Case Reporting in Georgia***

Georgia has a dual reporting system that legally requires HIV/AIDS reporting by both health care providers and laboratories (O.C.G.A. §31-12-2(b)). All health care providers diagnosing and/or providing care to a patient with HIV or AIDS has the obligation to report them to the Georgia Department of Public Health using the HIV/AIDS Case Report Form. Case report forms should be completed within seven days of diagnosing a patient with HIV and/or AIDS or within seven days of assuming care of an HIV-positive patient who is new to the provider, regardless of whether the patient has previously received care elsewhere. All laboratories certified and licensed by the state of Georgia are required to report all laboratory test results related to HIV/AIDS, such as positive Western Blot results, all detectable and undetectable viral loads, all CD4 counts, and all viral nucleotide sequence results.

Most of the information presented in this report is derived from the HIV/AIDS case reports collected as a result of mandatory reporting of HIV and AIDS infections in Georgia. Information from completed case reports are entered and stored in the Georgia Enhanced

HIV/AIDS Reporting System (eHARS). After entry of an initial case report in eHARS, if the case-patient's HIV infection progresses to AIDS, or if he or she dies, the report is updated with dates of progression or death.

Estimates of the number of newly diagnosed cases of HIV/AIDS and persons living with HIV/AIDS in Georgia presented in this report are based on case reports in eHARS. These estimates only reflect people diagnosed with HIV or AIDS and residing in Georgia at the time of diagnosis who have been reported and confirmed. The estimates do not include people diagnosed but not yet reported, HIV-infected people who only tested anonymously, or those unaware that they are infected.

An HIV/AIDS case is officially counted on the date the report is entered into eHARS. The number of cases reported during any specific period is typically a poor proxy for the number of cases actually diagnosed during that period. Spikes in the number of cases by report date often follow administrative changes in data collection procedures, such as the initiation of mandated HIV non-AIDS (HIV-NA) reporting in Georgia in 2003 and a change from HARS to eHARS in 2005 (i.e. the peak in HIV-NA cases in 2004 reflects new cases as well as cases diagnosed earlier but reported for the first time in 2004 due to the onset of mandatory reporting).

Although Georgia requires doctors and laboratories to report all suspected and confirmed cases of HIV infection within 7 days of diagnosis and regardless of disease severity, new cases might not be reported and confirmed until several

months after the date of initial diagnosis. Estimates in this report were not adjusted for that reporting delay.

### ***Public Health Department Structure in Georgia***

The Georgia Department of Public Health is composed of 18 Health Districts and 159 County Health Departments. Each Health District contains anywhere from one to 16 counties.

#### ***2010 Profile Highlights***

According to the CDC, Georgia had the 6<sup>th</sup> highest number of cumulative AIDS cases in the United States through 2008<sup>6</sup> and the 9th highest rate of AIDS cases per 100,000 population as of December 31, 2009.<sup>7</sup> The CDC estimated that 28,670 (range 20,008 - 37,332) adults and adolescents in Georgia were aware that they were infected with HIV (but did not have AIDS) in that same year.

### ***State Demographics***

In 2010, there were an estimated 9,687,653 persons living in the state of Georgia (Table 1). The majority of Georgia residents are also White, Non-Hispanic. Georgia has 159 counties, and based on the 2010 Census estimates, these counties have populations ranging from a low of 1,717 persons (Taliaferro) to a high of 920,581 persons (Fulton) (Table 4). The 2010 United States Census estimated that the population of the Atlanta MSA is 5,268,860. Other major MSA cities in Georgia include Augusta, which had 369,793 persons; Columbus, 241,918; Savannah, 347,611; Athens, 192,541;

Macon, 232,293; and Albany, 157,308 in 2010.

Persons 0-14 years of age comprised the majority of Georgians with 2,071,630 (Table 1). Individuals 60 years of age and above comprised the second-largest group with 1,528,041. People aged 15-19, 20-24, and 25-29 years comprised the three smallest age groups with 709,999, 680,080 and 673,935 persons, respectively. Females comprised slightly more of the overall population with 4,958,482 (51.18%) persons. Females and males comprised similar percentages of the population. However, in the 60 years and above age group, there were slightly more females (55.98%) than males (44.01%).

White, Non-Hispanics and Black, Non-Hispanics combined to make up 85.93% of the population with 5,413,920 and 2,910,800 persons, respectively (Table 2). Hispanic/Latino, Any Race comprised the third-highest percentage of the population with 8.81% (853,689 persons). Nearly 2% of the population defined themselves as Multiracial/Other, Non-Hispanic (171,121 persons).

### ***Georgia Health District Demographics***

In 2010, the East Metro Health District (3-4) had the highest total population with 990,494 people (Table 3). The metropolitan Atlanta Health Districts: Cobb/Douglas (3-1), Fulton (3-2), East Metro (3-4), and DeKalb (3-5) combined to make up 35.33% of Georgia's population (3,423,449 of 9,687,653 people) (Table 3). The least populated District was South Central (5-1) with 154,467 people. The Northwest District (1-1) had the most White, Non

Hispanics with 518,493 persons. The least amount of White, Non Hispanics was found in the South Central Health District (5-1) with 34,894 persons. The Fulton District (3-2) had a significantly larger population of Black, Non Hispanics compared to other regions (13.75% of the total Black, Non Hispanic population in the state, which is 400,457 people). The largest percentage of Hispanics was in the East Metro District (3-4) with 174,733 people (20.46%). Hispanics were fewest in numbers in the South Central District (5-1) with 6,130 persons (0.71%). Persons of Asian, Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander race/ethnicity were most populous in the East Metro District (3-4) with 87,571 people (7.63%); they were least populous in the South Central District (5-1) with 1,020 persons (0.32%). American Indian/Alaskan Natives were highest in number in the LaGrange District (4-0) and lowest in number in the South Central District (5-1) with 1,868 and 225 people respectively (8.77% and 1.05%).

### *Georgia County-Level Demographics*

With a combined total of 2,385,873 persons, the Atlanta metropolitan region counties of Fulton, Gwinnett, DeKalb, and Cobb tallied 24.62% of Georgia's population (920,581; 805,321; 691,893 and 688,078 people respectively) (Table 4). The counties with the lowest population included Taliaferro (1,717; 0.02), Webster (2,799; 0.03%), Glascock (3,082; 0.03%), and Echols (4,034; 0.04%).

### *Newly Diagnosed HIV/AIDS Cases in Atlanta Eligible Metropolitan Area (EMA)*

The Atlanta EMA is comprised of 20 counties: Barrow, Bartow, Carroll, Cherokee, Clayton, Cobb, Coweta, DeKalb, Douglas, Fayette, Forsyth, Fulton, Gwinnett, Henry, Newton, Paulding, Pickens, Rockdale, Spalding, and Walton. There were 795 newly-diagnosed HIV-NA cases and 512 AIDS cases in the Atlanta EMA in 2010 (Table 6). Of the HIV-NA cases, 24% occurred in individuals 30-39 years of age while individuals 30-39 and 40-49 years of age combined to make up 60% of the newly-diagnosed AIDS cases. Seventy-eight percent of the newly-diagnosed HIV-NA and AIDS cases in the Atlanta EMA were among Black, Non-Hispanic individuals.

### *Newly Diagnosed HIV/AIDS Cases in Georgia Counties*

There were 1294 newly-diagnosed HIV-NA cases in Georgia in 2010 (Table 5). Of these cases, 260 (20%) occurred in Fulton County (Table 13). DeKalb County also had a high number of new HIV-NA cases. DeKalb had 258 HIV-NA cases in 2010, which was 20% of the state's total. Clayton County had the third highest number of new HIV-NA cases in 2010 with 90 cases, or 7% of the state's total cases.

Fulton (164 cases), DeKalb (160 cases), and Clayton (64 cases) counties combined to comprise 52% of the state's new AIDS diagnoses in 2010 (Table 27).

### *Persons Living with HIV/AIDS in Atlanta EMA*

There were 27,560 individuals living with HIV-NA or AIDS in the Atlanta EMA as of December 31, 2010. Of these individuals, 78% were male (Table 29). Thirty-two percent of the individuals living with HIV-NA as of December 31, 2010 in the Atlanta EMA were 40-49 years old. Twenty percent of the cases in the Atlanta EMA as of December 31, 2010 occurred in females. Of these females, 20% occurred in HRH (see Technical Notes). Sixty-eight percent of persons living with AIDS in the Atlanta EMA as of December 31, 2010 were Black, Non-Hispanic, and 59% of persons living with AIDS were MSM (see Technical Notes).

### *Persons Living with HIV/AIDS in Georgia Counties*

Fulton County had the highest number of persons living with HIV-NA or AIDS as of December 31, 2010 with 11,740 (Table 50). Second to Fulton County was DeKalb County with 7,607. Clayton County had the third highest number of persons living with HIV-NA or AIDS as of December 31, 2010 with 1,952.

### *HIV and STD Co-infections*

STD co-infection (gonorrhea, *Chlamydia*, or syphilis) in persons with HIV/AIDS in Georgia in 2010 overwhelmingly occurred among males (82%) (Table 51). People 30-49 years of age had the highest percentage of co-infections with 63% of the total. Black, Non-Hispanics had the highest percentage of co-infection of all races/ethnicities, with 79% of cases. White, Non-Hispanics were a distant

second with 16%. In terms of HIV transmission category for males with HIV and STD co-infection, MSM were the highest with 64% of cases; NIR/NRR was second with 27%. For co-infected females, 23% reported HRH transmission and 10% reported IDU transmission. The majority of HIV and STD co-infected females reported NIR/NRR transmission (66%).

### *HIV and Tuberculosis (TB) Co-infection in Georgia*

There were 27 persons newly diagnosed with HIV/AIDS and TB co-infections in Georgia in 2010 (Table 52). Nearly 75% of these new cases were among males. The majority of newly diagnosed cases with HIV and TB co-infection were Black, Non-Hispanics (67%). Hispanic/Latinos, Any Race had the second highest number of co-infected cases with 19%. White, Non-Hispanics and Asian/Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, Non-Hispanics had an equal percentage of cases with 7% each. Persons 30-39 years of age had the highest percentage of reported TB co-infection with 33%; people 50-59 years of age had the second-highest percentage with 26%, and people 40-49 years of age had the third-highest percentage with 19%.

### *HIV/AIDS Deaths in Georgia*

Since 2001, there has been a general decline in the number of AIDS deaths in Georgia (Table 54). From 2001-2010, there was a 49% decrease in the number of AIDS deaths (from 592 to 299). During this time period, the number of HIV/AIDS-related deaths decreased by 53% in males and 40% in females. In 2010, among all

racess/ethnicities, the highest number of AIDS deaths occurred among Black, non-Hispanics (224) (Table 55). The highest number of deaths among all age groups occurred among individuals 40-49 years of age in 2010 (Table 56). In 2010, among all HIV transmission groups, the highest number of AIDS deaths occurred among NIR/NRR (Table 57).

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## **Technical Notes**

### **Case Definitions**

Persons “Newly Diagnosed with HIV infection (not AIDS)” refers to reported cases that meet the CDC surveillance case definition for HIV (not AIDS)<sup>1</sup> and were diagnosed in Georgia from January 1, 2010-December 31, 2010. Persons “Newly Diagnosed with AIDS” refers to reported cases that meet the CDC surveillance case definition for AIDS and were diagnosed in Georgia from January 1, 2010-December 31, 2010.

Persons “Living with HIV-NA” refer to reported cases that meet the CDC surveillance case definition for HIV (not AIDS) and were living in Georgia as of December 31, 2010. Persons “Living with AIDS” refer to reported cases that meet the CDC surveillance case definition for AIDS and were living in Georgia as of December 31, 2010. Cases of persons living with HIV/AIDS are based on a current residence in Georgia regardless of state of diagnosis and on current age as of December 31, 2010

Persons “Living with HIV-NA or AIDS” who were ever co-infected with a “New Reportable STD” refers to reported cases that meet the CDC surveillance case definition for HIV-NA or AIDS, were living in Georgia as of December 31, 2010, and were diagnosed with gonorrhea, *Chlamydia*, or syphilis at least 30 days after HIV diagnosis. The 30-day delay in assessing sexually transmitted disease acquisition was an attempt to minimize the bias that would result from classifying STDs that may have been present at the time of the initial HIV diagnosis as “new”.<sup>2</sup>

“Newly Diagnosed HIV/AIDS and TB” refers to reported cases that meet the CDC surveillance case definition for HIV (not AIDS); were diagnosed in Georgia from January 1, 2010-December 3, 2010; and were co-infected with pulmonary, disseminated, or extra pulmonary *Mycobacterium tuberculosis*.

All HIV-NA, AIDS, STD co-infections, and TB co-infections case counts include incarcerated persons and may inflate rates in certain geographic regions where there are large concentrations of HIV-positive inmates.

### **Transmission Category Definitions**

MSM refers to the transmission of HIV by male sexual contact with another male.<sup>1</sup>

IDU refers to transmission of HIV by receipt of non-prescribed drugs via injection, intravenously, intramuscularly, or subcutaneously.<sup>1</sup>

Perinatal refers to transmission of HIV from mother-to-child.<sup>1</sup>

Blood recipient refers to transmission of HIV through blood or blood components.<sup>1</sup>

HRH refers to transmission of HIV through heterosexual contact with a person known to have HIV infection or at least with a person at increased risk of HIV infection (based on a history of MSM, IDU, or receipt of blood products).<sup>1</sup>

NIR refers to HIV cases in which an HIV risk factor cannot be identified or confirmed even though (1) all available data sources have been reviewed or

contacted or (2) epidemiological follow-up was either not initiated or not completed, but 12 months have elapsed since the date of the initial case report.<sup>1</sup>

NRR refers to HIV cases that were reported without any risk factor information.<sup>1</sup>

### *Reporting Period*

Numbers are based on data reported through June 30, 2011, and are not adjusted for reporting delays.

### *Population Estimates*

Estimates to determine population sizes are derived from the 2010 US Census.

### *Rates*

Rates are per 100,000 population. Rates based on estimated numbers less than 12 should be interpreted with caution because the estimates have relative standard errors greater than 30% and are considered unreliable.

### *Unmet Need*

Unmet need is defined as the absence of any viral load or CD4 laboratory test results for persons reported HIV-positive in either eHARS or the Georgia Laboratory Access Database during the period of interest.

### *Data Suppression*

For counties and geographic areas with fewer than 50,000 residents, case counts of 1, 2, 3, or 4 were not released in compliance with the Georgia HIV/AIDS Epidemiology Section Security and Confidentiality Guidelines

Vol. 4.<sup>3</sup> In these instances, case counts of less than 5 were denoted as "<5."

### *Data Limitations*

Data are derived from Georgia eHARS and may be underestimated due to factors related to timeliness and completeness. Completeness of case ascertainment for a diagnosis year is measured 12 months after the diagnosis year by comparing the number of cases diagnosed and reported to the surveillance system for a given year to the number of cases expected to be diagnosed during that year.<sup>2</sup> Timeliness is defined as the number of expected cases that have not been reported at a given time point added to the proportion of cases that are not reported in a timely manner.<sup>2</sup> Consequently, interpret results with caution.













Figure 5: Rates of New HIV/AIDS Cases<sup>1</sup>, Georgia, 2001-2010




Figure 6: Rates of New HIV/AIDS Cases<sup>1</sup> by Gender, Georgia, 2001-2010




**Figure 7: Rates of New HIV/AIDS Cases<sup>1</sup> among 15-24 Year Olds by Gender, Georgia, 2001-2010**




**Figure 8: Rates of New HIV/AIDS Cases<sup>1</sup> by Race/Ethnicity among Males, Georgia, 2001-2010**



**Figure 9: Rates of New HIV/AIDS Cases<sup>1</sup> by Race/Ethnicity among Females, Georgia, 2001-2010**




**Figure 10: Rates of Persons Living with HIV/AIDS<sup>2</sup>, Georgia, 2001-2010**




**Figure 11: Rates of Persons Living with HIV/AIDS<sup>2</sup> by Gender, Georgia, 2001-2010**




**Figure 13: Rates of Persons Living with HIV/AIDS<sup>2</sup> by Race/Ethnicity among Females, Georgia, 2001-2010**
