

Haemophilus Influenza type b (Hib)

Age Indications for Hib Vaccines

ActHIB® (sanofi pasteur): for aged 2 through 71 months PedvaxHIB® (Merck): for aged 2 through 71 months Hiberix (Novartis): Last dose for age 12 through 71 months

Indications for Use and Schedule

- Primary Series
 - ActHIB: 3-dose series at 2, 4 & 6 months
 - PedvaxHIB: 2-dose series at 2 & 4 months
 - booster dose at 12-15 months
- -Delayed Vaccination Schedule:
 - Children starting late may not need entire 3-4 dose series
 - Number of doses child requires depends on current age
 - All children 15-59 months of age need at least one dose

Minimum age -

- 6 weeks

With the exception of Hiberix, the conjugate HIb vaccines are interchangeable.

Vaccine Administration

- · Intramuscular (IM) injection in the deltoid and anterolateral thigh of the arm 1-1.5 inch, 22-25 gauge needle
- · Use professional judgment in selecting needle length
- · Give simultaneously with all vaccines

Storage and Handling

- Store in the refrigerator between 35°-46° F (2°-8° C); Do NOT freeze
- · Keep in the original box
- · After reconstitution, HIBERIX, ActHIB and PedvaxHIB should be administered promptly or stored refrigerated between 2° and 8°C and administered within 24 hours. If the vaccine is not administered promptly, shake the solution vigorously again before injection.

^{*}HIBEREX IS APPROVED ONLY FOR THE LAST DOSE OF THE HIB SERIES AMONG CHILDREN 12 MONTHS AND OLDER

CONTRAINDICATIONS

- An anaphylactic (severe allergic) reaction to a prior dose or a component of Hib vaccine
- Age younger than 6 weeks

PRECAUTIONS

- Moderate to severe acute illness
- Use caution when vaccinating latex-sensitive individuals since the vial stopper contains dry latex rubber that may cause allergic reactions

FURTHER POINTS

- Persons indicated for a 2-dose primary series who previously received only a 1st dose of MCV4, should get a 2nd dose of MCV4
