DHR and ACS Release Georgia Cancer Data Report 2000

On October 19, the Georgia Comprehensive Cancer Registry and the Southeast Division of the American Cancer Society released its first cancer data report.

The report includes incidence and mortality data by county for the top five

cancers in the state of Georgia, as well as expected cancer cases and deaths for the year 2000, completeness of case reporting, and behavioral risk factor surveillance data.

The report is intended to be a useful reference for anyone interested in

cancer prevention, screening, research, education, and treatment in Georgia.



Completeness of Case Reporting

In 1995, cancer became a notifiable disease in Georgia. Health care providers are required to report all cancer cases in their patient population to the Georgia Comprehensive Cancer Registry.

It is important that all cancer cases are reported to the central registry in a complete and timely manner so that statewide cancer incidence data may be

analyzed, disseminated, and utilized. The data may then be used by the Georgia Division of Public Health, health care providers, and Georgia citizens to monitor cancer trends, identify and evaluate cancer morbidity and mortality problems, and design and evaluate cancer control strategies. Failure to report cases makes it impossible to accurately assess the burden of cancer in Georgia. Without this knowledge, it is difficult to determine where to spend precious prevention and screening dollars.

1997 Casefinding audits are currently underway in Georgia hospitals. You will be informed if you are going to be audited. Participation is mandatory for all hospitals that are chosen. **Q**: When is my submission due?

A: Hospitals must report cancer to the central registry within six months from the date of diagnosis of cancer. Facilities must report **monthly** either by electronic or photocopy submission. All hospitals with a total licensed bed size of more than 100 beds **must** submit the required data electronically. A facility will be considered delinquent for the monthly submission if data has not been received by the 5^{th} of the following month. For example, January submissions must be received on or before February 5^{th} to be considered timely.

Free standing laboratories and radiation facilities must submit an electronic list of all cancer patients to the central registry on a yearly basis.
