Types of violent death include: Suicide, homicide, unintentional firearm injury, legal intervention, and deaths of undetermined intent.


DESCRIPTION

- The Georgia Violent Death Reporting System (GVDRS) is part of the National Violent Death Reporting System (NVDRS)
- Population-based system
- Collects detailed information on victims and suspects, including demographics, location of injury and death, weapon type, and precipitating circumstances.
- Able to report on multiple-death incidents, including mass shootings and homicide-suicides

MULTIPLE SOURCES OF DATA

- Death certificates
- Medical examiner and/or coroner death investigations
- Law enforcement records
- Crime laboratory records

NVDRS GOALS

- Inform decision makers about the magnitude, trends, and characteristics of violent death
- Evaluate and continue to improve state-based violence prevention policies and programs








