



Georgia Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC)

Certification Period Guidelines

- A. <u>Pregnant Women</u>: the duration of their pregnancy and up to six (6) weeks postpartum. There is no extension granted beyond the six (6) week postpartum cutoff.
- B. <u>Breastfeeding Women</u>: ends in the month of her breastfed infant's first birthday or until cessation of breastfeeding.
 - a) The certification period for the breastfeeding woman is up to one (1) year; however, she must be scheduled for a mid-assessment between 5-7 months of her delivery date. If she misses this appointment, the participant can receive one month of vouchers until she has completed the mid-assessment.
 - b) If the woman ceases to breastfeed and is more than six (6) months postpartum, she is categorically ineligible and must be terminated from the Georgia WIC Program immediately
 - c) If the woman ceases to breastfeed prior to six (6) months postpartum, the woman is still eligible to participate on the WIC program as a non-breastfeeding postpartum woman. However, her category and certification end date must each be changed to reflect her non-breastfeeding post-partum status.
 - d) The woman must qualify for WIC based on the risk criteria for a postpartum, non-breastfeeding woman to continue receiving benefits. If no nutrition risks are evident, Risk Code 401 (Other Dietary Risk / Failure to Meet Dietary Guidelines) should be assigned.
 - e) The woman's status, priority, and food package must be updated.
- C. <u>Postpartum, Non-Breastfeeding Women:</u> up to six (6) months from the termination of their pregnancy.
- D. <u>Infants:</u> until their first birthday if certified at age six (6) months or younger. A nutrition assessment (midcertification) by the CPA should be completed between five (5) and eleven (11) months of age. If certified after reaching age six (6) months, the certification is for six (6) months.
- E. <u>Children:</u> for one (1) year from the date of each certification. Eligibility may continue until they reach their fifth birthday. However, a half-certification must be performed at 5-7 months between each certification.
