

## **Evidence-based Public Health (EBPH) Resources**

Resources to systematically find, assess, and demonstrate evidence for public health programs and policies

This resource list is a combination of resources highlighted and used in the EBPH course (Ross Brownson, course developer) and resources identified as often used by public health professionals in a 2014 survey of over 1200 public health professionals from 12 states. The survey included staff at state and local health departments, universities, community based organizations and coalitions, and multiple other agencies which provide public health services or partner with public health agencies.

This resource can be used to find health data, information on health interventions, and other evidence needed to make scientifically informed program or policy decisions. While every effort to organize resources by main content area was made, several resources overlap in content areas and type of information provided. \*The list does not represent an exhaustive list of resources for each content area.
