Thanks to effective HIV treatments that allow people to live longer, healthier lives, the number of people ages $\mathbf{5 0 +}$ living with HIV is increasing in Georgia

Among people ages 50+ who were living with HIV in Georgia, 62\% were virally suppressed in 2021.

This is comparable to people of all ages living with HIV in Georgia in 2021 ( $60 \%$ were virally suppressed). Achieving viral suppression is critical for both the patient's health and preventing forward transmission of HIV.

In 2021, the rate of HIV among people ages $50+$ living with HIV was nearly $2 x$ higher in metro Atlanta compared to non-metro Atlanta.


Note: Metro Atlanta area is defined as the 20 Atlanta EMA (Eligible Metropolitan Area) counties that are eligible for Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Part A Grants.
