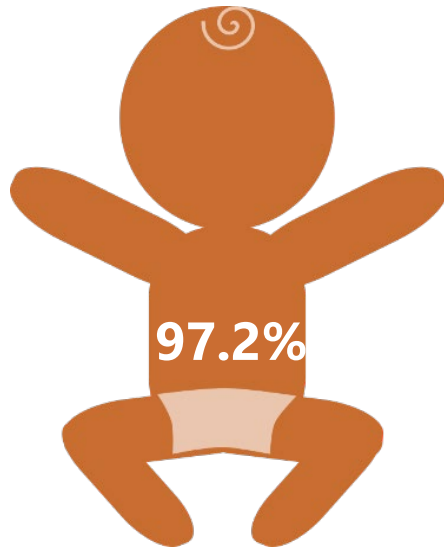

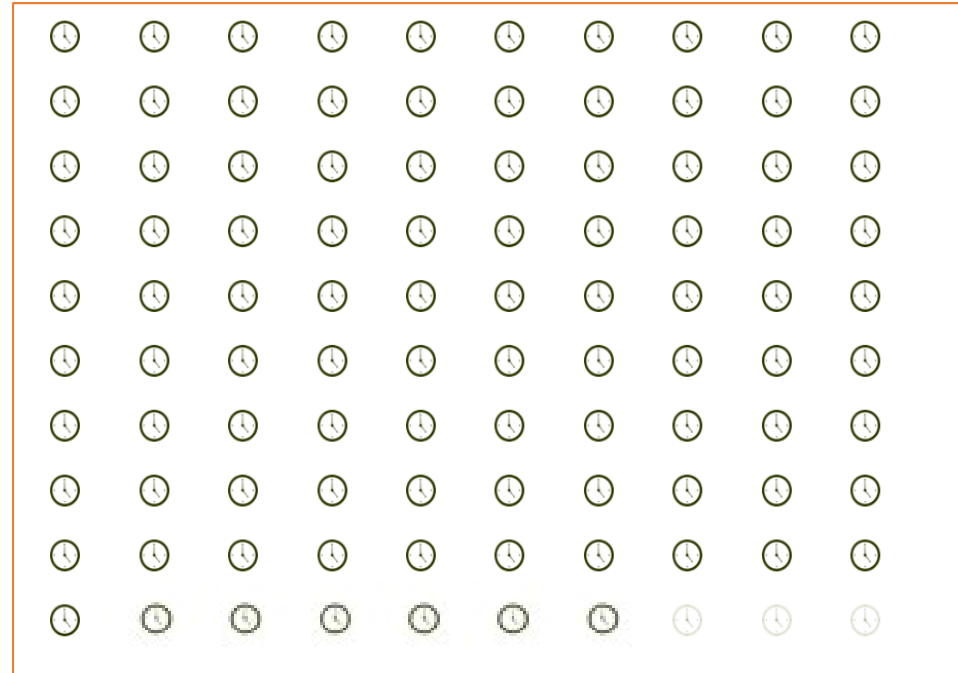

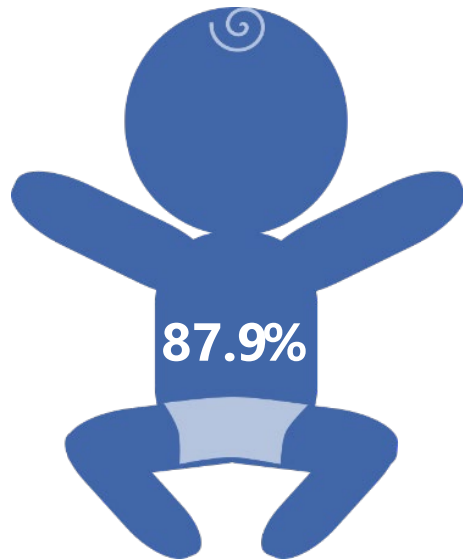

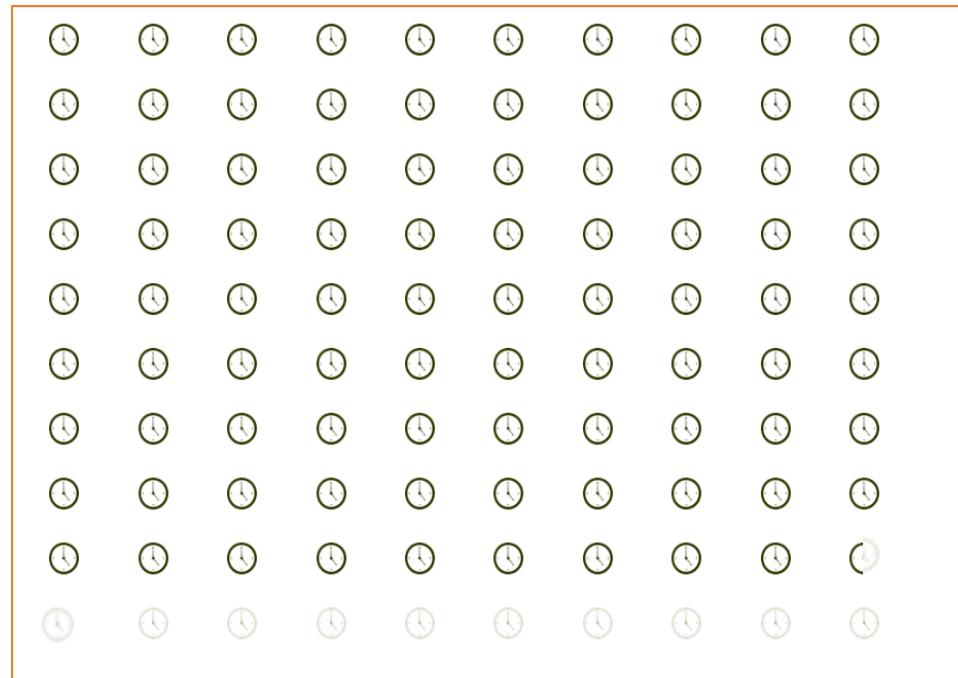

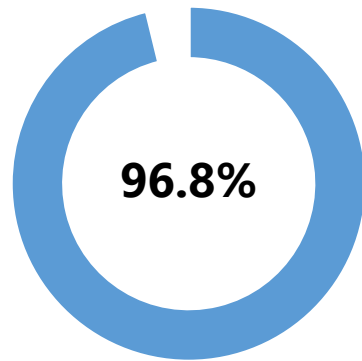

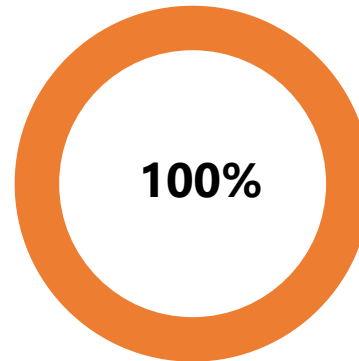
Indicator 8: Early Childhood Transition

Services Within Timeline



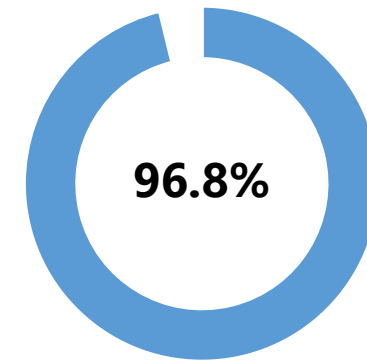

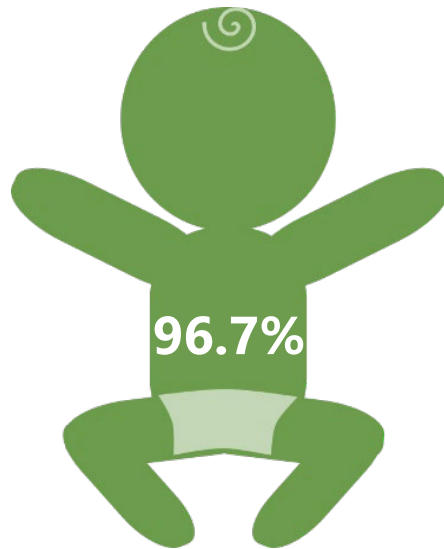

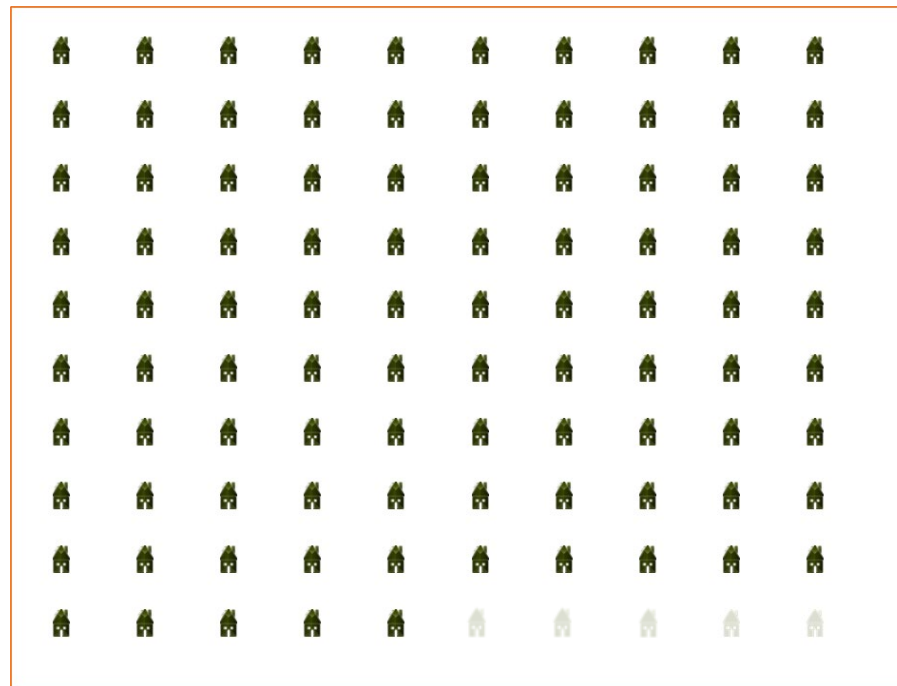

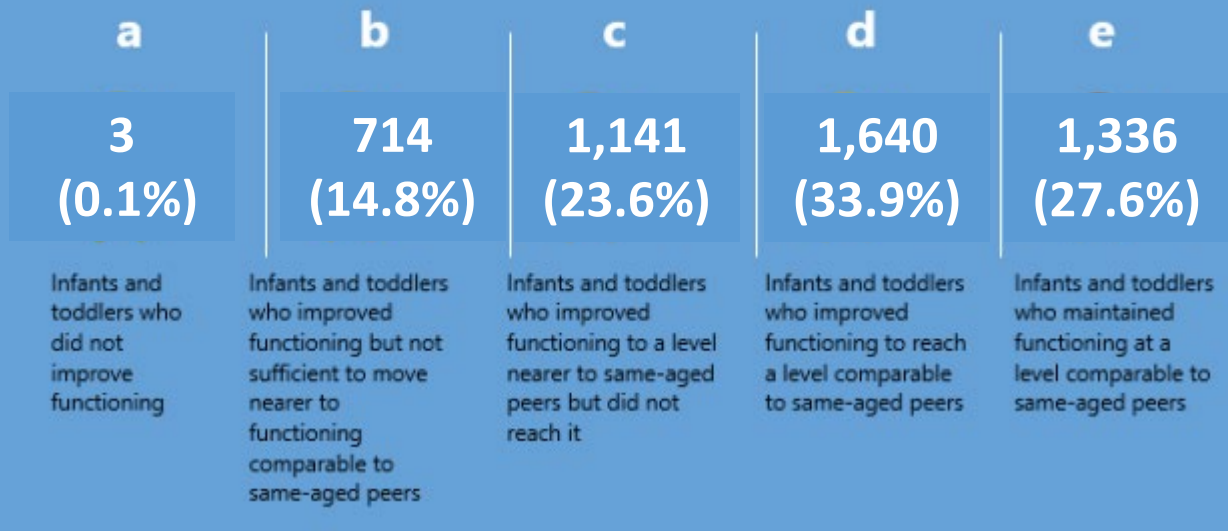

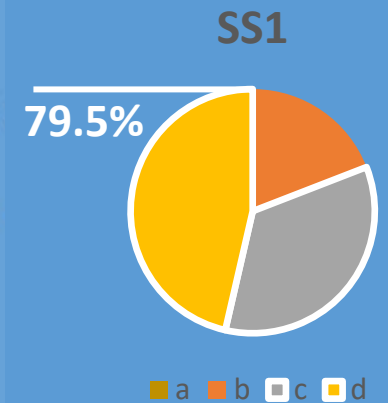

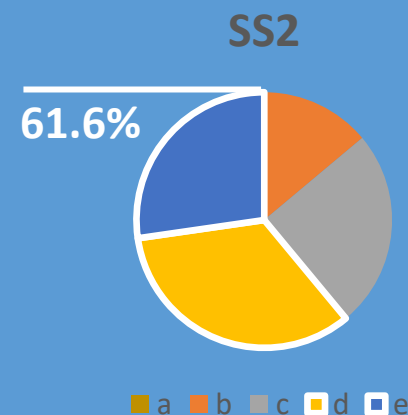

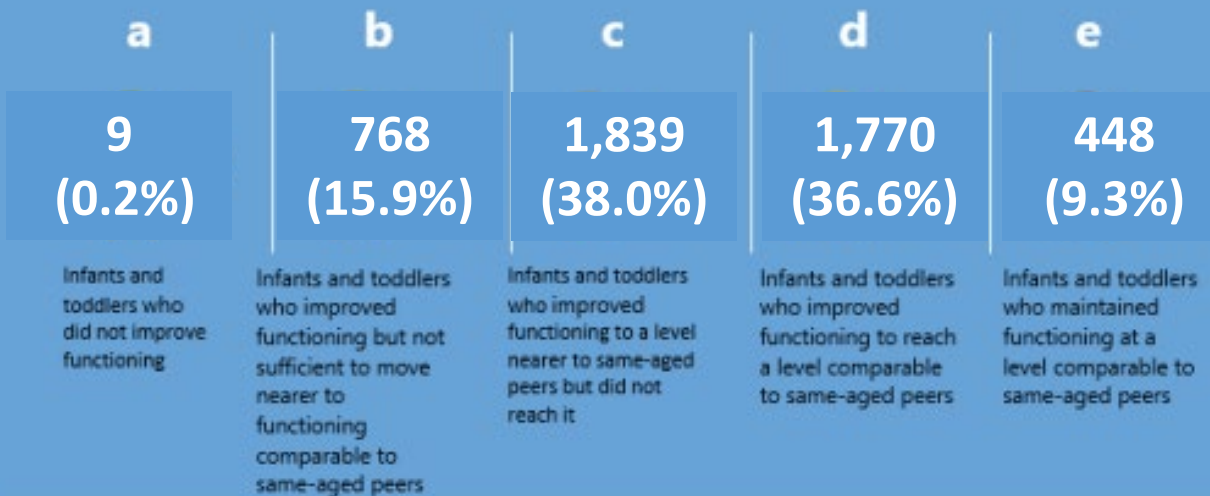

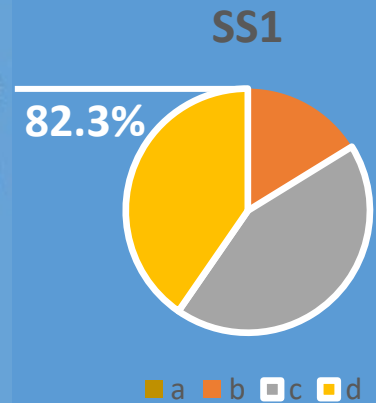

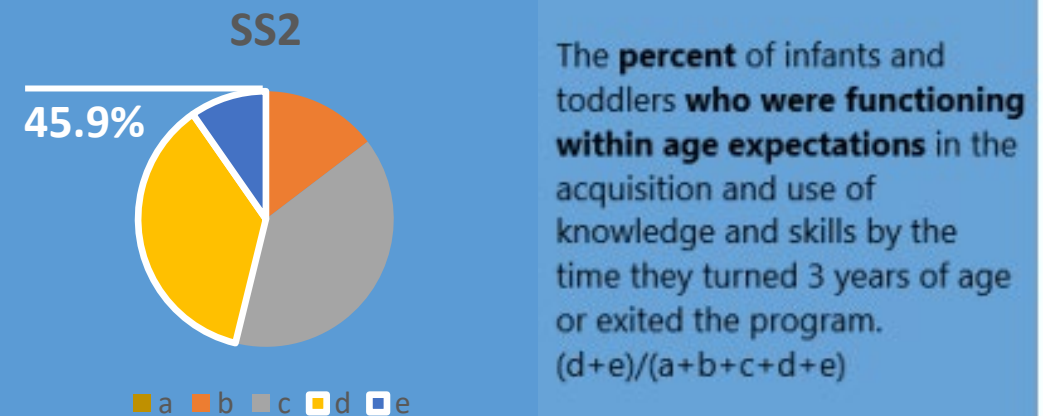

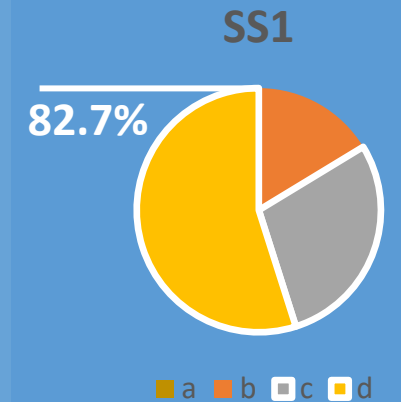

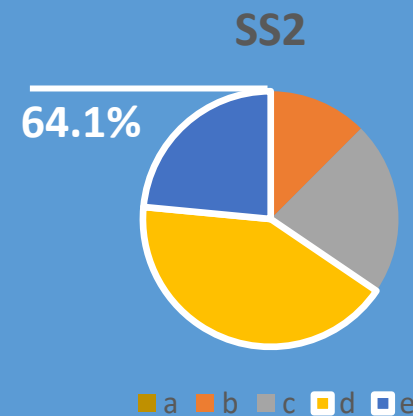

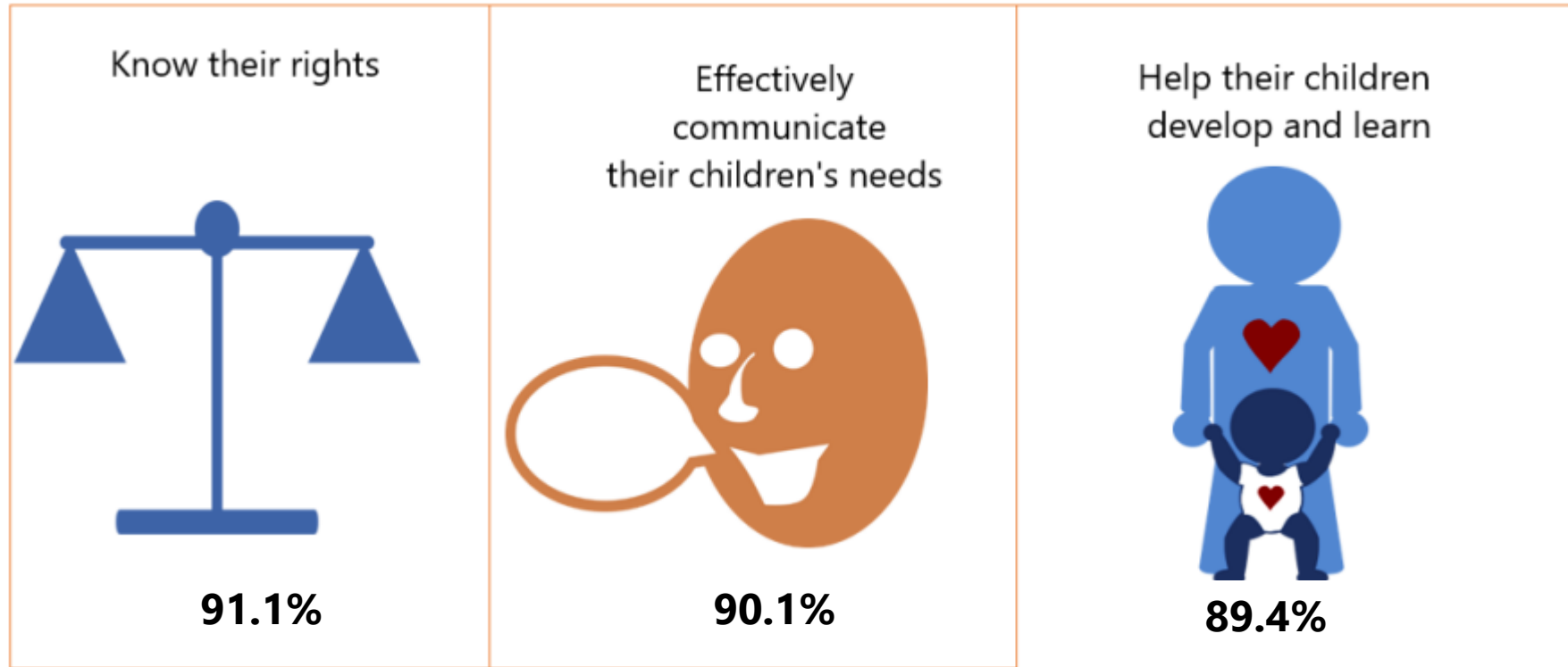

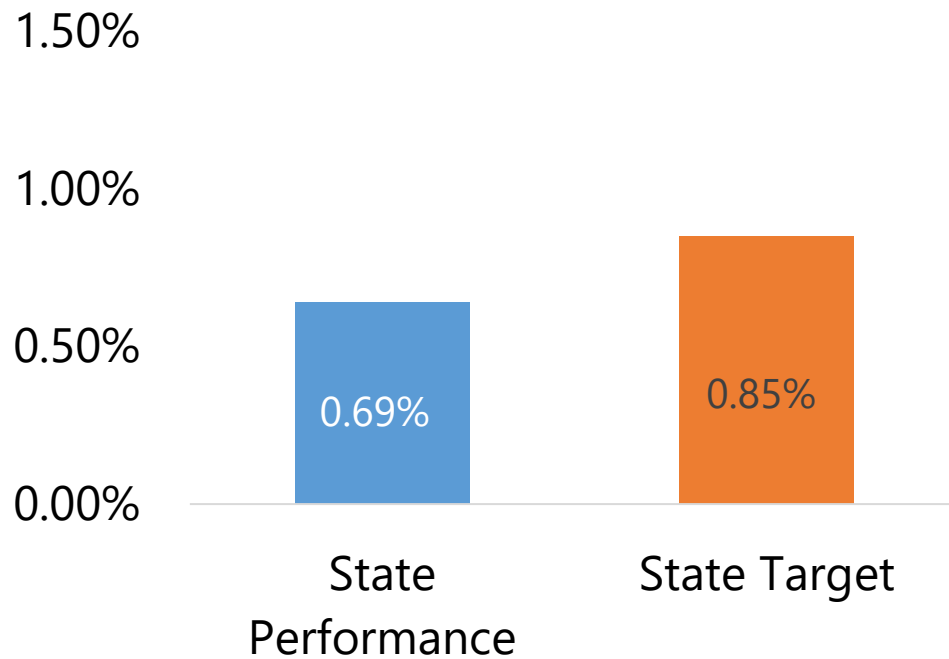

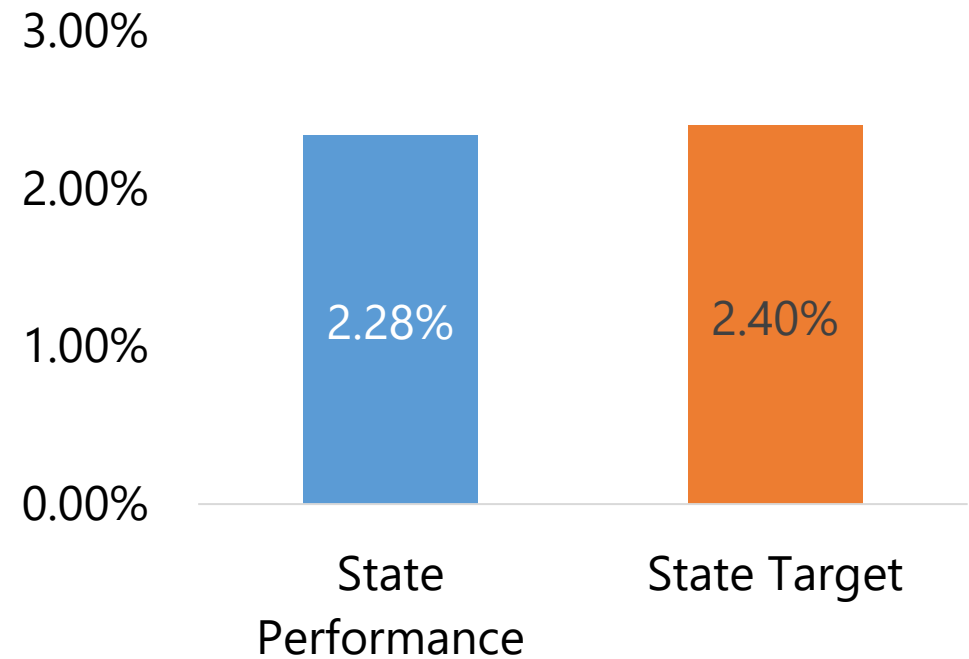
Indicator 5: Child Find, Ages Birth to 1

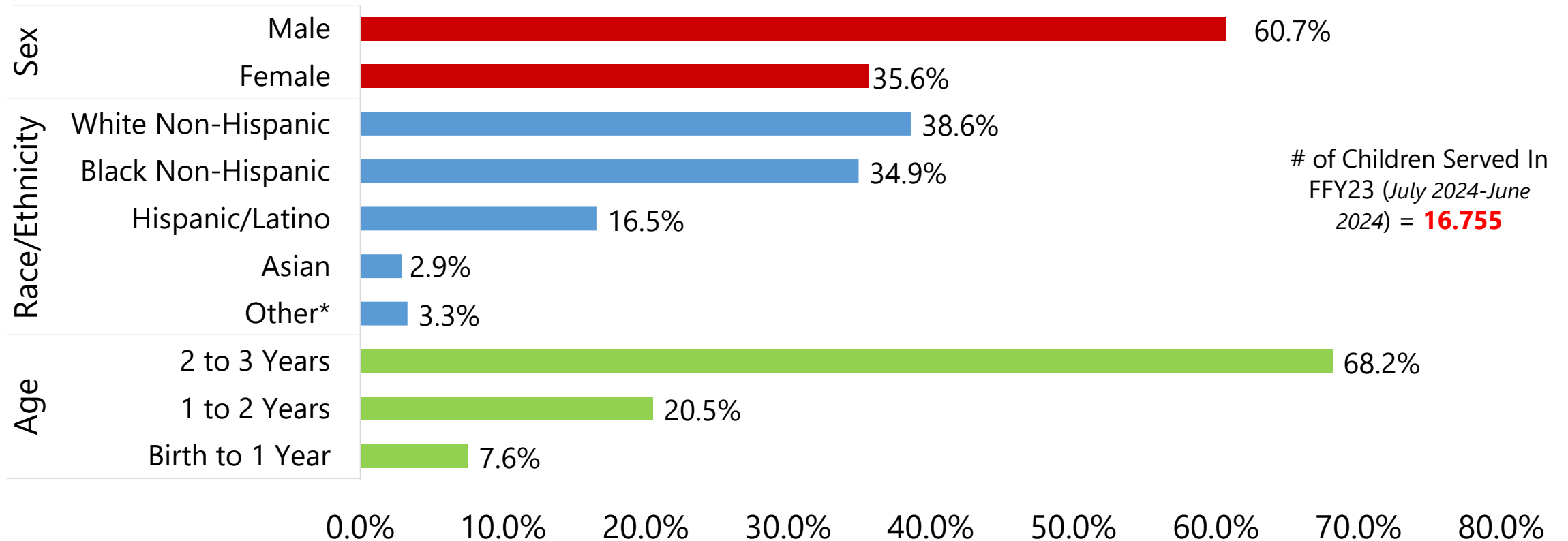
Percent of infants and toddlers ages birth to three with IFSPs*
