### **Graduation Requirements**

Graduation from the Georgia Department of Public Health WIC Dietetic Internship Program is expected by the end of the 49-week program with successful completion and documentation of Intern Learning Outcomes and Competencies. If the intern is not able to complete the program in this time due to an authorized reason, the internship may be extended to a maximum of 16.5 months.

**For completion of the program, interns must meet the following requirements:**

- Have a completed master's degree (a verification statement will not be issued until all coursework is completed and final transcript is submitted showing degree conferred and conferral date)
- Complete 1000 hours minimum of planned supervised practice hours
- Complete didactic learning experiences
- Obtain a satisfactory rating on all rotations and examinations
- Submit documentation showing achievement of all Core Competencies for the Registered Dietitian for each rotation to the Dietetic Internship staff at the end of each rotation
- Submit all required time logs, evaluation forms, self-assessments by the assigned due dates
- The intern must demonstrate no misconduct, academic or non-academic, and must perform ethically in accordance with the values of the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics
