Mission and Goals

Georgia Department of Public Health (DPH) WIC Dietetic Internship Program Mission

To improve the health outcomes of Georgians through promotion of quality nutrition care practice by assisting qualified employees of the Georgia Department of Public Health's Special Supplemental Program for Women, Infants, and Children to become Registered Dietitians competent to practice at entry level.

Program Goals and Outcome Measures

<u>DPH WIC Dietetic Internship Goal 1:</u> The DPH WIC Dietetic Internship will prepare graduates to be competent at an entry level through high quality educational offerings.

Outcome Measures:

- The program's one-year pass rate (graduates who pass the registration exam within one year of first attempt) on the CDR credentialing exam for dietitian nutritionists is at least 80%.
- 100 percent of program graduates take the CDR credentialing exam for dietitian nutritionists within 12 months of program completion.
- 80% of employers will rate graduates as competent at entry level.
- At least 80% of program intern's complete program/degree requirements within 16.5 months (150% of the program length).
- Of graduates who seek employment, 90% of graduates will be employed in Nutrition and Dietetics or related fields within 12 months of graduation.

<u>DPH WIC Dietetic Internship Goal 2:</u> The DPH WIC Dietetic Internship will prepare graduates who will continue to practice in community nutrition care services in Georgia after internship completion.

Outcome Measures:

• 50% of dietetic internship graduates will indicate working/volunteering in nutrition within Georgia Department of Public Health two (2) years after internship completion.
