September 14, 2022

The data include laboratory positive monkeypox cases in Georgia and data on persons who have received monkeypox vaccine in Georgia. The data are inclusive of case reports and vaccine information received by the Georgia Department of Public Health available by 10 am on 9/14/2022. Data are updated weekly and are subject to change as follow up activities are ongoing.
