



Nicotine Poisonings from E-Cigarettes in Georgia (January 1, 2011 to April 15, 2017)


- There were a total of 254 calls made to the Georgia Poison Center about nicotine poisoning from e-cigarettes during January 2011 to April 2017.
- Nicotine poisoning from e-cigarettes was more common among males than females (males 133; females 116).
- There was a sharp decrease in the number of nicotine poisoning calls due to e-cigarettes in 2016 (41) than in 2015 (83).
- The number of calls about nicotine poisoning from e-cigarettes in Georgia sharply increased between 2011 and 2014 and then decreased between 2015 and 2016 (Figure 1).
- Among the 254 calls, routes of nicotine poisoning from e-cigarettes were: ingestion (n =195), dermal (n=35), inhalation/nasal (n=25), and ocular (n=19).
- The majority (64%; n=163) of e-cigarette nicotine exposures occurred among children age 0-5 years; 30% (n=77) occurred among adults age 19 years and older.
- The most common routes of exposure for ecigarette nicotine poisoning among children aged 0-5 years were: ingestion of the nicotine liquid (n=144), followed by dermal (n=12) and inhalation/nasal (n=4).
- The most common routes of exposure for ecigarette nicotine poisoning among adults age 19 years and older were: ingestion (n=34), followed by inhalation/nasal (n=15), ocular (n=14), and dermal (n=13).
- The LaGrange Health District (4-0) had the highest total number of calls (n=36) about nicotine poisoning from e-cigarettes during 2011-2017 (Map 1).
