NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING

Chapter 511-2-4 "Reporting of Venereal Disease"

The Department of Public Health proposes revisions to the rules located in Chapter 511-2-4, "Reporting of Venereal Disease" pursuant to its authority under Georgia Code Sections 31-2A-6, 31-12-2, 31-17-2.

The purpose of the proposed rulemaking is to update terminology for sexually transmitted diseases pursuant to legislative amendments.

RULES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEAL TH

CHAPTER 511-2 DISEASE SURVEILLANCE AND CONTROL

511-2-4 REPORTING OF VENEREAL SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED DISAESE

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Rule 511-2-4-.01 Definitions

Unless a different meaning is required by the context, the following terms as used in these Rules shall have the meaning hereinafter respectively ascribed to same:

- (a) "Department" means the Georgia Department of Public Health.
- (b) "Venereal Sexually Transmitted Disease" is any case of chlamydia, syphilis, gonorrhea or chancroid.
- (c) "Case of Venereal Sexually Transmitted Disease" is any person diagnosed as having a venereal sexually transmitted disease.
- (d) "Test" is any laboratory procedure conducted for the purpose of aiding in the discovery or diagnosis of a venereal sexually transmitted disease.
- (e) "Reactive or Positive Test" means any laboratory result suggesting the presence of venereal sexually transmitted disease.

Rule 511-2-4-.02 Reporting of Venereal Sexually Transmitted Disease

- (1) Any physician or other person who makes a diagnosis of or treats a case of venereal sexually transmitted disease, any superintendent or manager of a hospital, dispensary, or charitable or penal institution in which there is discovered a case of venereal sexually transmitted disease shall report it immediately to the Department. Each such venereal sexually transmitted disease case shall be reported to the Department by giving name, address, color, age, sex, and a diagnosis on forms furnished by the Department.
- (2) All laboratories conducting tests for <u>venereal sexually transmitted</u> disease shall report to the Department daily, as they occur, all reactive or positive tests for <u>venereal sexually transmitted</u> disease by giving name, address, color, age and sex of patient on forms furnished by the Department.
- (3) Information reported on these forms shall be kept confidential by the Department.
