Policy

WIC participants must be referred to other health-related services and public assistance programs for which they are eligible. All WIC participants not already enrolled in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Medicaid, and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) must be referred at least one time. Participants shall be informed of these programs and, if needed, be provided with the addresses and telephone numbers of local/state offices.

Purpose

To ensure WIC participants are provided access to health care and services to maintain and enhance their overall health.

Procedures

- I. Local agencies are encouraged to coordinate with and refer participants to the Cooperative Extension Service, Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP), Head Start, Pre-K, and other programs.
- II. Staff should refer participants to other health services offered within the health department system and other agencies and services. These include, but are not limited to:

IV. CPAs shall provide additional prenatal information, assistance, or support to participants in need, and refer participants to the appropriate person(s) designated through the local agency breastfeeding program for additional breastfeeding information.
