Post Licensure Skills

 Revised SOP (PLS) Policy and posted to website <u>https://dph.georgia.gov/EMS/post-licensure-skills-pls-paramedics</u>

• <u>Revisions:</u>

- Agency approval will be for 2 years.
 - Education request and education will still have to be done on an annual basis
- Added a Post Licensure Skill
 - Initiation of the administration of Blood/Blood Products in prehospital environment

Post Licensure Skills

Post-Licensure Skill for Paramedics

1. Initiation and maintenance of **Advanced Transport Ventilators (ATV)** that are capable of more advanced modes (i.e., capable of adjusting more than rate and tidal volume).

2. Initiation of additional units of blood/blood products, includes initiating an additional blood/blood product infusion if supplied by the sending facility after all proper safety checks are completed by the sending facility and the ambulance has addressed appropriate storage and temperature maintenance during transport.

3. Maintenance of Intra-Aortic Balloon Pumps (IABPs)

4. Maintenance of Transvenous Cardiac Pacing (TVP) devices

5. Maintenance of external cardiac support devices, including percutaneous Left Ventricular Assist Devices (pLVAD), Extra Corporeal Membrane Oxygenation (ECMO) devices, etc.

6. Administration or maintenance of high flow oxygen via nasal cannula.

Initiation of the administration of blood/blood products in the pre-hospital environment.


es > Post-Licensure Skills (PLS) for Paramedics

Post-Licensure Skills (PLS) for Paramedics

Post-Licensure Skills (PLS) for Paramedics are those skills that are above and beyond the normal scope of practice for a Georgia licensed Paramedic as listed on the current Scope of Practice for EMS Personnel.

Paramedics are permitted to perform only those additional post-licensure skills listed below at an EMS agency that has been approved to utilize those post-licensure skills for paramedics, and only once the paramedic has been: *trained* on those skills; *certified* as competent; *credentialed* to perform those skills by the agency's EMS Medical Director; and only while operating under standing, verbal or written *orders* from the agency's EMS Medical Director, transferring physician, or medical control physician. Georgia licensed Paramedics are only permitted to perform any of the skills above if the following requirements are met for **EACH** specific skill for **EACH** EMS agency that the skill will be performed at.

EMS agencies will only be approved to utilize post-licensure paramedic skills if all the requirements below are met.



Cardiac PLS – Transvenous Pacing

- Transvenous pacing has been approved and placed on TRAIN
- Course if 0.5 hours
- If approved by the Local Medical Director, this course can satisfy the requirements for the Cardiac PLS – Transvenous Pacing
- Skill checkoffs must still be done



ALS Redesign Timeline

We are eager to share this updated timeline and encourage you to share your feedback with us. The proposed timeline is as follows and can be subject to change:

- September 2022: Begin testing performance items
- July 2024: Launch new ALS examination
- July 2024: Start phasing out the psychomotor examination
- June 2025: End of psychomotor examination

Performance Examination



Welcome!

You are about to begin a demonstration of the new Performance Component of the National Registry's ALS examinations. This demo contains a single performance scenario with several associated examination questions that measure clinical judgment, leadership, and communications. The scenario is divided into three sections or phases corresponding to the three components of the EMS call that the scenario describes: **En Route**, **Scene**, and **Post Scene**. The scenario and questions display as follows:

- The scenario information displays on the left side of the screen and the questions on the right side.
- Several examination questions are presented for each phase. The questions display one-by-one, but the phase information remains on the left side of the screen for each question.
- Tabs above the scenario permit navigation among the different phases, with certain restrictions described below.
- Each question indicates at the top the phase the question is based on.

The **En Route** phase and its associated questions will be presented first. Refer to the En Route information on the left side of the screen to answer each question. After you select your response(s) to a question and click the Next button, the next question will display, but the En Route information will remain. You will have access to only the En Route information while answering the En Route questions.

The Scene phase of the scenario will display next, along with the first question based on that phase. Use the Scene information to answer each of these questions. If you need to refer back to the En Route phase, you can click the En Route tab to display and review this information. Then you can click the Scene tab to again display the Scene information. You cannot, however, return to any of the previously answered questions. Also, you cannot display the Post Scene information until you have answered all Scene questions.

When you have completed the last Scene question, the Post Scene information will display, along with the first Post Scene question. When answering the Post Scene questions, you have the option of **going back to review** both the Scene and En Route phases of the scenario by clicking their respective tabs. Again, however, you cannot go back to any earlier questions.

This scenario is only a demonstration of the structure and functionality of the Performance Component of the actual ALS examination. The length and content of the scenario itself, and the number of questions based on the scenario, will vary depending on the examination level and the scenario's subject matter.
