### COVID-19 Notifications to First Responders

- Two parts
  - Prospective
    - o Testing data is received by DPH
    - o Daily cases are pulled and sent to 911 PSAPs (GEMA/HS)
    - o 911 PSAPs create flag for address
    - o 911 call at a flagged address
  - Retrospective
    - Hospitalized Patients vs. Non-hospitalized patients
    - Regional EMS Staff notifications to First Responder Agencies

Hospital/Acute Care Facility and/or Labs eport COVID-19 cases to DPH through **SENDSS** Daily COVID-19 Cases are pulled from SENDSS by GEMA/HS GEMA/HS separates list by county/city and sends the appropriate list to 911 PSAPs, broken down by the cases in their jurisdiction 911 PSAPs flag address for no longer than 21 days after the Date of Onset reported in data from DPH If a 911 call occurs at a flagged address during the 21 day period, the 911 PSAP will notify the responding personnel of the existence of a COVID-19 case at that address



#### NOTE

- COVID-19 <u>IS</u> in your community
- Every person in your community has NOT been tested (some have, but not all)
- There are delays in testing results being reported to DPH (patient waits to get tested, lab waits to send data, etc.)
- List will contain only the addresses of those who have been tested and the data reported to DPH
- Do NOT let this list be a false sense of security take precautions on ALL calls
- 911 PSAPs should continue to ask the COVID-19 screening questions for all requested responses

#### For this to work...

- All EMS Agencies must submit data on ALL calls
- MUST have the correct:
  - Patient First Name
  - Patient Last Name
  - Patient Date of Birth

## Notifications to agencies

- Cases are tied to the district where the patient <u>lives</u> but we are searching against where the calls are <u>run</u>
- Will come by encrypted email from one of the Regional EMS staff (may be from a different region)
- You may get multiple notifications per day
