EMS Personnel License Renewal

Personnel License Renewal (1,412)

EMT, EMT-I, AEMT, CT, Paramedic

Late Georgia Medic Renewal application available until September 30, 2024.

- Continuing Education (CE) must be entered into Education Report into LMS
- Must upload BCLS and ACLS (if applicable) cards inside the renewal application
- License renewal fee, \$75.00, Late fee, \$75.00 (Credit Card fee \$2.75)

Applications LATE Georgia Medic Renewal This is the LATE medic renewal license for all medics (EMT, EMT-I, AEMT, CT, Paramedic) in Georgia. The late renewal phase = 6 months post-license expiration. The Late Renewal fee is \$75.00 in addition to the license renewal fee.

Renewal Application: Georgia EMT-R Renewal

EMT-R Renewal Requirements:

- Sixteen (16) hours CE (Dept approved/Dept recognized)
 - Modules & hour requirements specified in current EMR National Continued Competency Program (NCCP) specified by NREMT
 - Continuing Education (CE) must be entered into Education Report into LMS
- Current CPR/BCLS certification
- Current EMR certification through NREMT
 - Prior to renewal of EMT-R license, the licensee's certification through the NREMT shall be renewed.
- License renewal fee, \$75.00 (Credit Card fee \$2.75)

Renewal Application will close on **September 30th** for those that expire **2024**



Key Performance Measures and Other Considerations for Emergency Response Zones Georgia Office of EMS and Trauma

Introduction

These measures are to be used when a REMSAC has determined a need to perform a detailed examination and assessment (based on the statutory criteria of economy, efficiency, and benefit to the public welfare) of an Emergency Response Zone. In consultation with EMSAC, and to address the need for objective measures that will be evaluated and benchmarked for the review of an Emergency Response Zone(s), the following Key Performance Measures have been selected. When a review is conducted, only measures listed in this document will be utilized for the Emergency Response Zone review. Additional measures may not be utilized if quantifiable data is not available, and the Department of Public Health has not approved.

Office of EMS and Trauma worked with EMSAC to update Performance Measures listed in document.






Prehospital Pediatric Readiness Assessment

 - Benchmarking against agencies nationally with the same pediatric volumes as your agency




Prehospital Pediatric Readiness Assessment



Validation Rules Changes (released April 2024)

- Rules that went into effect 6/1/2024
 - GA Rule 4569 Requires Dispatch Notified Date/Time on ALL responses (Warning Level)
 - GA Rule 4568 Requires PSAP Call Date/Time on ALL responses (Error Level)
 - GA Rule 4570 Requires Dispatch Priority (Patient Acuity) on 911 responses and Hospital-to-Hospital Transfers (Warning Level)
- Communicate with your ePCR vendor to ensure they have applied the changes accurately and/or made necessary changes in CAD systems.
- Schematron File, Validation Rules Export, Facilities List, and Change Log published and posted on the GA NEMSIS page. https://nemsis.org/state-data-managers/state-map-v3/georgia/





Advanced Placement Guidance



Guidance for Advanced Placement in EMS Education

This document should be used to guide the course hours for Advanced Placement for Allied Health Providers

EMS Initial Education Programs should use this chart to determine the minimum course requirements for an Allied Healthcare Provider seeking to become an EMS Provider. All Advanced Placement (AP) courses must be taught by a Georgia Designated EMS Education Program and the course must be approved by the Office of EMS & Trauma (OEMST). Any Allied Health Provider must be licensed and in good standing with their respective licensing board to be considered for AP.

A gap analysis must include a full review of the provider's academic transcript, applicable work history, and any post licensure certifications earned. These documents and rationale for acceptance must be available to the OEMST for evaluation.

Critical Care Guidance

Guidance for Critical Care Programs in Georgia This document should be used to design and implement a Critical Care.

This document should be used to design and implement a Critical Care Education Program or course and to outline licensing requirements for a Bridge Program

Critical Care Education Programs

Critical Care Education Programs must be designated by the OEMST in the same process as all other levels of Initial Education. This process will include the following:

- Facility Inspection (Classroom and Lab space sufficient for all activities)
- Minimum Equipment inspection (see CCP minimum Equipment List)
- Designation Application
 - Verification of Clinical/Field contracts
 - Program Director Certification Form (Must be licensed as a Georgia Paramedic and Georgia Paramedic I/C and *Board Certified as CCP or FP-C)
 - Lead Instructor (must be licensed as a Georgia Paramedic and Georgia Paramedic I/C and Board Certified as CCP or FP-C)
 - Medical Director Certification form (Must be licensed as an EM Board Certified physician in Georgia)

Critical Care Courses

Critical Care Courses must be taught at designated Critical Care Programs and each course must be approved by the OEMST. Each course must be taught by an approved instructor as noted above. All courses must meet the following requirements for approval:

- Be at least 160 hours of Didactic/Lab/Simulation instruction
- Be at least 80 hours of Clinical
- Complete the CCP Student Minimum Competency (SMC)

^{*}Must be Board Certified beginning on or after January 1, 2026

Hybrid Critical Care Courses

Agencies and Personnel may use a hybrid approach (online and in-person) models to achieve their certification. The OEMST will publish a list of acceptable Critical Care Programs that can teach the academic portion, they would then be required to complete the lab/simulation (SMC) requirements with a Georgia Designated Critical Care Program. A small example of acceptable programs are listed below:

- FlightBridgeEd
- FOAMfrat
- UMBC
- UofF

As an example of how this could work: An EMS agency could pay for its personnel to attend an online CCP course and then become designated following the designation model above and complete the lab/simulation/clinical (SMC) portions with their personnel.

Programs that do not have a qualified lead instructor can utilize a hybrid model and allow an EM or EMS Board Certified physician or EMS Fellowship trained to complete the lab/simulation (SMC) requirements.

Licensure Criteria

- Complete a Georgia OEMST approved CCP course
- Obtain IBSC CCP, FP-C, or BCEN CFRN or CTRN board certification
- Possess NREMT Paramedic Certification
- Apply for Georgia Critical Care Paramedic Licensure

Recertification/Relicensure Criteria

- Maintain IBSC board certification
- Maintain NREMT Paramedic certification
- Complete 40 hours of Ga approved Continuing Education every 2 years

Grandfather/Bridge Option

The grandfathering period will remain in effect until January 2026. This option will be in place to allow those who already possess certain credentials or experience to be able to obtain their CCP licensure. Any questions or clarification should be directed to Richard Rhodes at richard.rhodes@dph.ga.gov.

Any person who has taken a Critical Care Course that the OEMST can evaluate to ensure that it meets minimum requirements is eligible for grandfathering. Additionally, the following requirements will be in place:

- Complete a skills competency verification by a Georgia Designated Critical Care Program
 - The PD should perform a gap analysis** and determine what, if any remedial education is needed and then verify minimum competency using the Georgia CCP SMC
 - Those currently working in a Flight/Critical Care setting could use their work experience and annual competencies to satisfy minimum competency
- Possess IBSC or BCEN board certification
- Possess NREMT Paramedic certification

^{**}A gap analysis must include a full review of the provider's academic transcript, applicable work history, and any post licensure certifications earned. These documents and rationale for acceptance must be available to the OEMST for evaluation.

Some programs will notice that their pass rate stayed the same while their overall ranking went down

License Audits

License Audits began on April 1st

- A small percentage of all renewal applications were identified at random for audit
- Those being audited received an email there will be nothing for you to do unless we reach out to you for more information
- We may ask for further verification of courses attended, so ensure that you have documentation

Audit Process

- BLS Certification (Approved Sponsor, Valid dates)
- ACLS Certification, if applicable (Approved Sponsor, Valid dates)
- TIM Education and valid verification
- CAH Education and valid verification
- Continuing Education Hours
 - Topical hours requirement (Trauma, Cardiac/Stroke, Pediatric)
 - Correct amount of hours
 - Certificate or valid verification of education obtained

Audit Findings and Actions


93% of all accounts audited had some type of compliance issue

Most accounts had multiple compliance issues and the overall percentages are listed in the graph

In the future, medics will be sent notification of a compliance issue and given 30 days to correct/comply

- If they do not comply, their license will be placed on a 3-month probation
- If they do not comply within the 90-day probation, their license will be suspended, and they will not be able to work
