

#### End of the Public Health Emergency Declaration

What it means for Georgians

ATLANTA – The federal Public Health Emergency (PHE) declaration will expire at the end of the day. Now that we have safe and effective vaccines, ample testing infrastructure, and most people have some level of immunity due to vaccination or infection, COVID-19 is no longer a public health emergency.

As a result of these and other efforts in Georgia, since the end of the peak of the Omicron surge at the end of January 2022:

- Daily COVID-19 reported cases are down over 98%,
- COVID-19 deaths have declined 97%, and
- Newly reported COVID-19 hospitalizations are down 97%.

In Georgia, the end of the PHE will have minimal impact on the public. Most prevention tools, like vaccines, treatments, and testing, will remain available. Other tools such as certain data sources and reporting, will change.

COVID vaccines and tests will still be available at no cost to the public at health departments.



## National Scope of Practice - Capnography


- GA Scope of Practice is being updated to include utilization of Capnography at the AEMT level.

- Any EMS agency that will allow AEMTs to utilizes Capnography within the Agency's protocols must ensure that all AEMT personnel have completed the required training.











## Ambulance Patient Offload Time (APOT)

**Patient Offload**: is the difference in minutes between the time of the patient arrival at destination (eTimes.11) and the time of patient transfer of care (eTimes.12).

#### **Biospatial: Transport Dashboard**

- Data Explorer Widget (3<sup>rd</sup> widget in dashboard)
- Ambulance Patient Offload Times Widget (5<sup>th</sup> widget in dashboard)

#### Notes:

- etimes.11-**Patient Arrived at Destination** = The date/time the responding unit arrived with the patient at the destination or transfer point.
- etimes.12 **Time of Patient Transfer of Care** = The date/time that patient care was transferred to the destination healthcare staff



Pilot Areas: White County, Lumpkin County (LEO, EMS, Hospitals)


Deterministically link **Crash Records**, **EMS Records**, and **Hospital Records** with one unique number.



- All Motor Vehicle Collisions (MVC/MVA)
- All MVC/MVA versus Pedestrian
- All MVC/MVA versus bicyclist
- All MVC/MVA versus motorcyclist
- All MVC/MVA versus ATVs













#### 1.0 PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to specify the requirements for data compliance and reporting for EMS Agencies.

#### What's new?

- All medics must be rostered in the agencies ePCR system properly. (Section 5.5)
- All ePCR systems must be configured & secured so that the medic license number or level may not be altered by anyone other than the EMS Agency System Administrator. (Section 5.6)

#### 1.0 PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to specify the requirements, compatibility, and compliance of ePCR vendors for EMS responses from EMS agencies in Georgia and the mandatory reporting requirements for NEMSIS v3.5 and all future NEMSIS versions.

#### What's New?

 Beginning with GEMSIS Elite v3.5 data reporting, all ePCR software vendors must be approved by Department to be utilized within Georgia's EMS system.



## GEMSIS Elite v3.5 Transition

- Finalizing testing of new ePCR form, validation rules, etc.
- Currently determining training dates in June with EMS Agency Directors and Data Managers.
  - GEMSIS Elite users will be switched over first, in phases.
- Developing Checklists for EMS Agencies of items that EMS Agencies will need to address for the transition to v3.5.
- ePCR Software Vendor compliance testing will begin once Validation Rules and Schematron File are published
