
## Georgia Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) Monthly Report—May 2022

What is the PDMP? The PDMP is an electronic database used to collect, monitor, and analyze prescribing and dispensing data about controlled substances (such as opioids, benzodiazepines and stimulants) in Georgia. The PDMP collects details of every Schedule II – V prescription drug order dispensed in Georgia. The purpose of this report is to describe opioid prescribing patterns in Georgia on a monthly basis. 

## Prescriptions by Drug Type & Year, Georgia, 2016-2021



From 2020 to 2021, the number of opioid prescriptions decreased by 8%, benzodiazepine prescriptions by 14%, and stimulant prescriptions by 8%.





