

Georgia Weekly Influenza Report

MMWR Week 09

Updated 3/11/2016

Week 09 (Feb. 28 - Mar. 5, 2016) Synopsis

During week 09 there was moderate influenza activity in Georgia with regional occurrences of sustained flu transmission.

- **Outpatient Illness Surveillance (ILINet):** The proportion of outpatient visits for ILI was **2.96%**, which is **above** the Georgia baseline of 1.6%.
- **Geographic Spread of Influenza:** The geographic spread of influenza in Georgia was **REGIONAL** during week 09.
- **Metro Area Hospitalizations:** There were 28 hospitalizations due to influenza infection during week 09. There have been 214 hospitalizations due to influenza infection so far this season.
- **Influenza Related Deaths:** There were 0 confirmed deaths due to influenza. There have been 2 confirmed influenza-associated death as of 3/11/2016.
- **Viral Surveillance:** Of the **687** specimens tested by Georgia clinical laboratories reporting to the National Respiratory and Enteric Virus Surveillance System (NREVSS) during week 09, **126 (18.34%)** were positive for influenza. Public Health Laboratories tested 32 specimens during week 09, 13 were positive for influenza.
- **Reported Influenza Outbreaks:** There were **2** reported to public health during week 09. There have been 2 influenza-related outbreaks so far this season.
- **RSV Viral Surveillance:** Of the **347** specimens tested and reported by the Georgia Public Health Laboratory (GPHL) and the National Respiratory and Enteric Virus Surveillance System (NREVSS) collaborating laboratories during week 09, the percent positive of **ALL** laboratory tests was 5.5%.

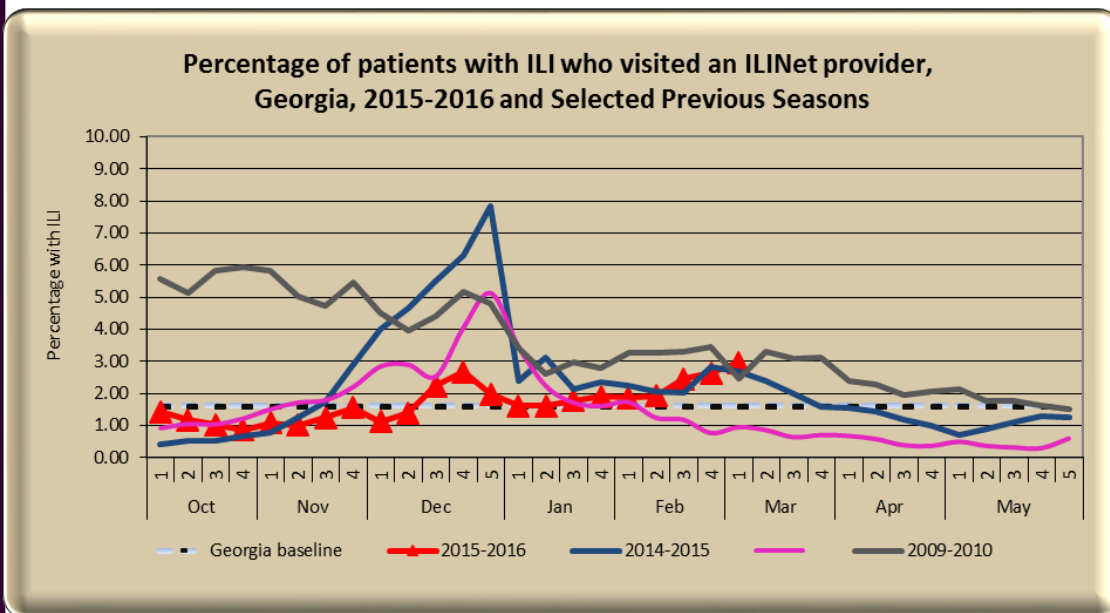

ILINet Provider Network Data



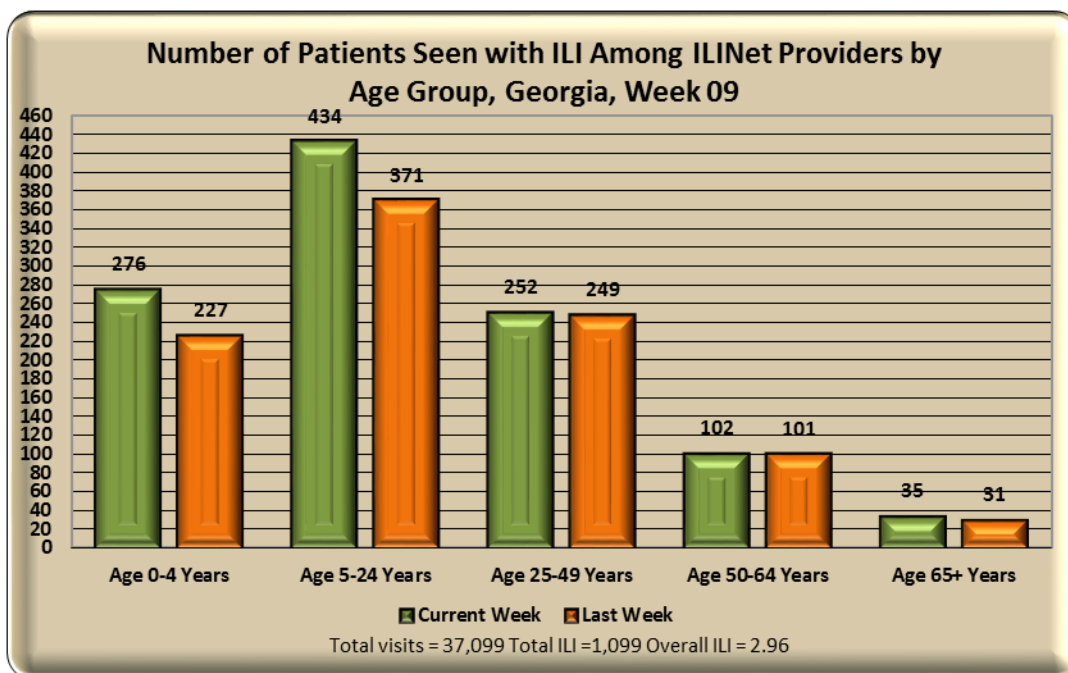
This Week: **2.96%** of patients seen in ILINet Provider offices were diagnosed with ILI.

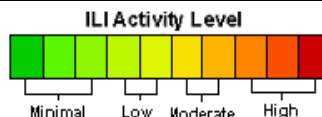
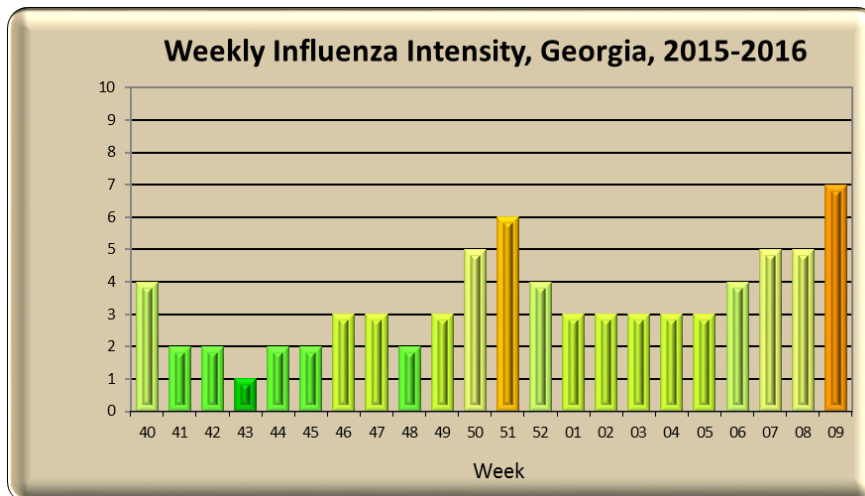
ILI Activity Level Indicator - ILINet

ILI Activity Levels (1 - 10) correspond to the number of standard deviations away from the 3-year mean for the current week.

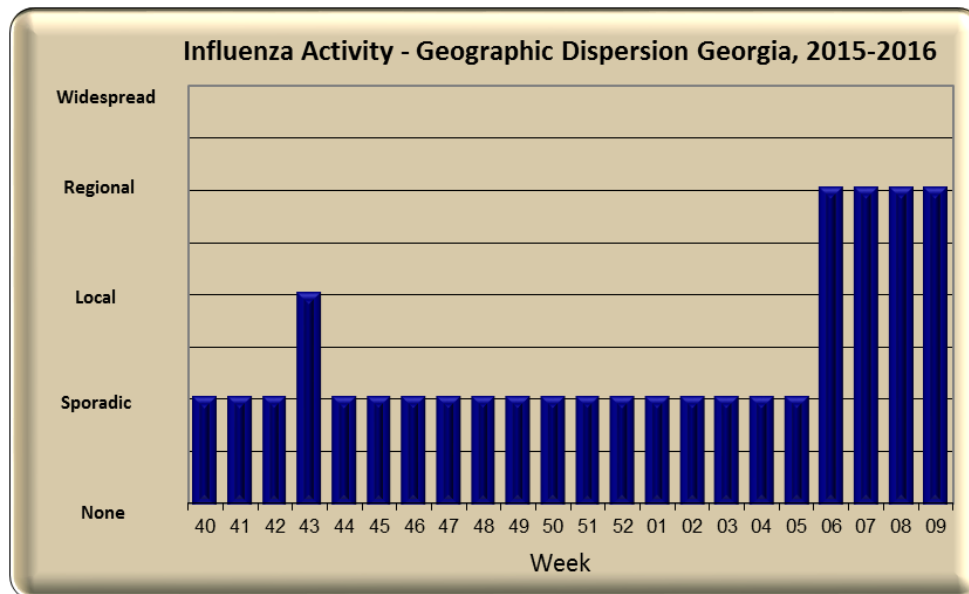
This week the intensity level is: **Moderate = 7**

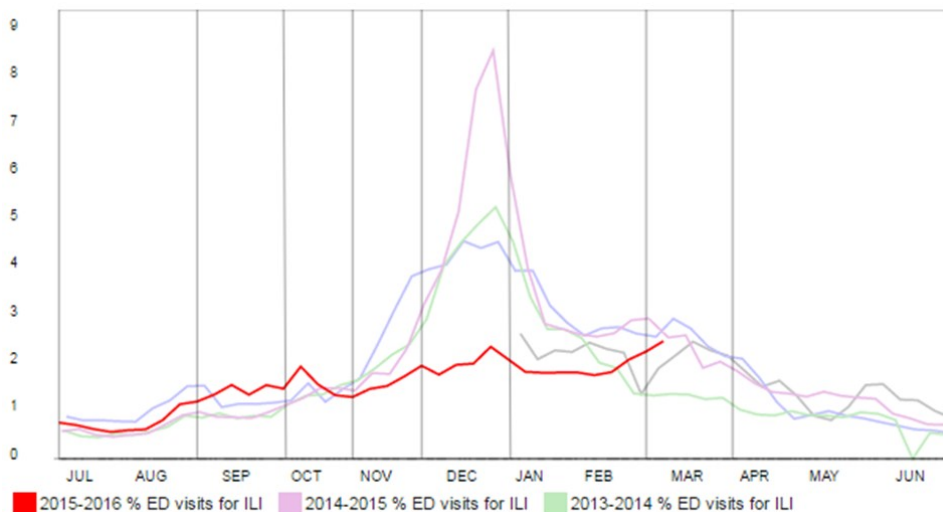

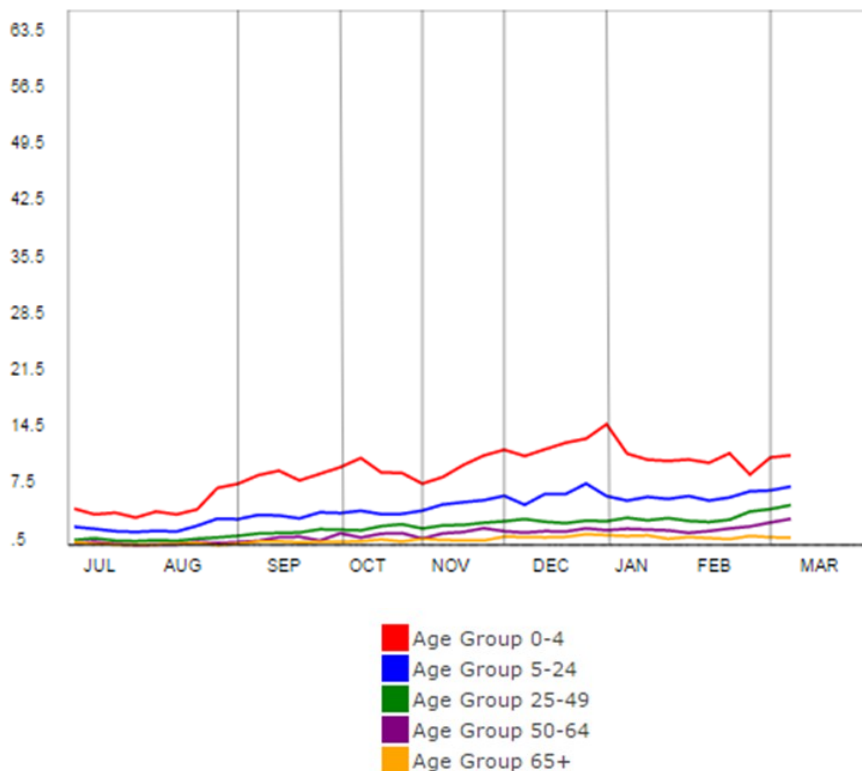

Percentage of Patients with ILI Syndrome Visits by Age Group



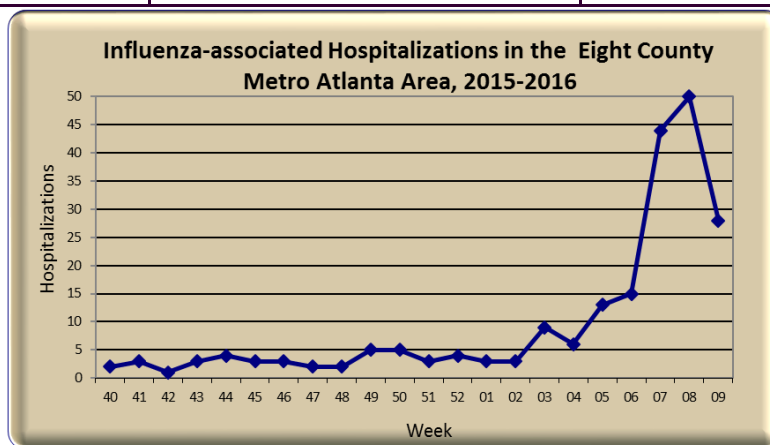

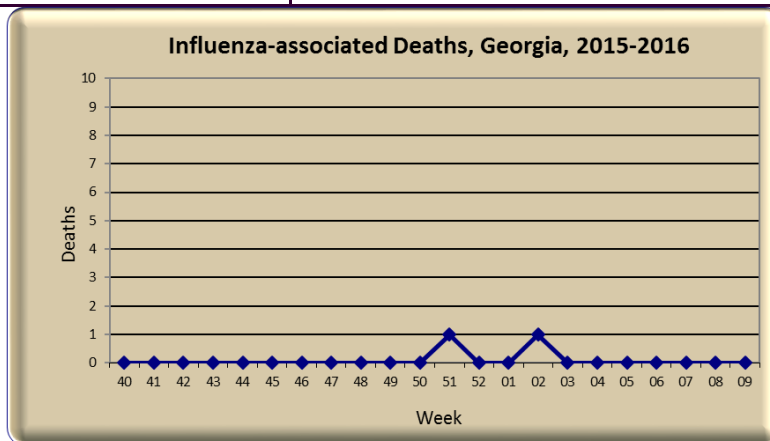
Influenza Hospitalizations in the eight county metro Atlanta area 2015-2016 (Emerging Infections Program data)

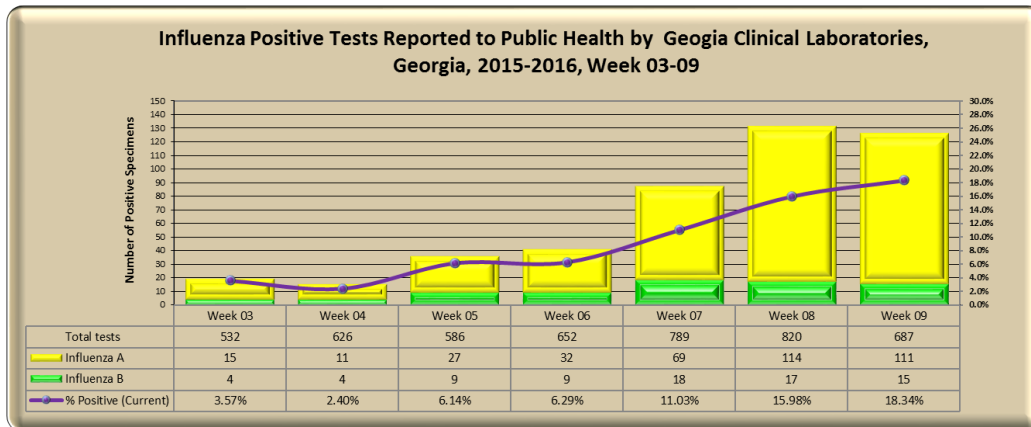

Influenza-Associated Deaths 2015-2016 Statewide (Influenza-associated deaths are a notifiable condition in Georgia)



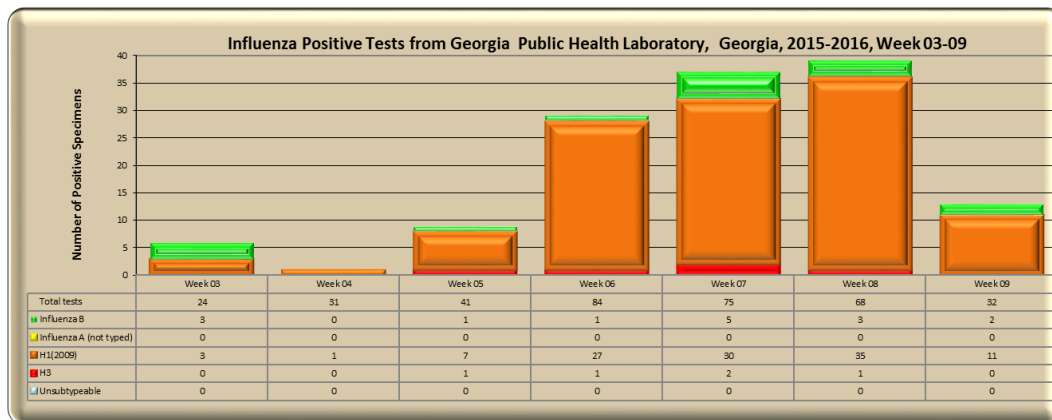

Georgia Virologic Surveillance Data



During **week 09** Georgia clinical laboratories reporting to NREVSS tested 687 specimens for influenza, 126 (18.34%) were positive. The predominate strain identified was influenza A.

Note: No subtyping information will be released from clinical laboratories



Public Health Laboratories tested 32 specimen for influenza during **week 09**, 11 **Influenza A(H1N1) pdm09** and 2 **influenza B**.

Georgia threshold of RSV season on-set and end

RSV season onset is defined as the first week of two (2) consecutive weeks when the percent positive of **ALL** lab confirmed tests are greater than or equal to 10%. The end of RSV season is now defined as the first week of two consecutive weeks when the percent positive of **ALL** lab confirmed tests are less than 10%.
