# Georgia Weekly Influenza Report

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#### MMWR Week 42

Updated 10/28/2016

Week 42 (October 16 - 22, 2016) Synopsis

During week 42 there was minimal influenza activity in Georgia with sporadic occurrences of sustained flu transmission.

- Outpatient Illness Surveillance (ILINet): The proportion of outpatient visits for ILI was 2.03%, which is below the Georgia baseline of 2.1%.
- **Geographic Spread of Influenza:** The geographic spread of influenza in Georgia was **SPORADIC** during week 42.
- **Metro Area Hospitalizations:** There was I hospitalization due to influenza infection during week 42. There have been 6 hospitalizations due to influenza so far this season.
- **Influenza Related Deaths:** There were 0 confirmed deaths due to influenza.
- Viral Surveillance: Of the 153 specimens tested by Georgia clinical laboratories reporting to the National Respiratory and Enteric Virus Surveillance System (NREVSS) during week 42, 2 (1.31%) were positive for influenza. Public Health Laboratories tested 4 specimens during week 42, 0 were positive for influenza.
- **Reported Influenza Outbreaks:** There were 0 outbreaks reported to public health during week 42.
- **RSV Viral Surveillance:** Of the **297** specimens tested and reported by the Georgia Public Health Laboratory (GPHL) and the National Respiratory and Enteric Virus Surveillance System (NREVSS) collaborating laboratories during week 42, the percent positive of **ALL** laboratory tests was 18.86%.



This graph displays the number of patients seen at sentinel provider offices and diagnosed with ILI in the past week. The data are stratified by age-group.


#### **ILINet Provider Network Data**



This Week: 2.03% of patients seen in ILINet Provider offices were diagnosed with ILI.

Note: The Georgia baseline is formulated by averaging ILI percentage during weeks of endemic activity determined by laboratory results for influenza.




#### Georgia ILI Intensity Indicator



#### Syndromic Surveillance Data Weekly Influenza-like Illness Syndrome (percentage of ILI visits by Age Group)


## Percent of ILI Visits to Georgia Emergency Departments by MMWR Week

#### Number of Patient Visits with ILI Syndrome by Age Group




Influenza Hospitalizations in the eight county metro Atlanta area 2016-2017 (Emerging Infections Program data)








#### Georgia Virologic Surveillance Data



During **week 42** Georgia clinical laboratories reporting to NREVSS tested 153 specimens for influenza, 2 (1.31%) were positive. The only strain identified was influenza A.

Note: No subtyping information will be released from clinical laboratories



Public Health Laboratories tested 4 specimens for influenza during week 42, none were positive.

RSV season onset is defined as the first week of two (2) consecutive weeks when the percent positive of **ALL** lab confirmed tests are greater than or equal to 10%. The end of RSV season is now defined as the first week of two consecutive weeks when the percent positive of **ALL** lab confirmed tests are less than 10%.
