Georgia Weekly Influenza Report

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MMWR Week 50

Updated 12/22/2017

Week 50 (December 10 — December 16, 2017) Synopsis

During week 50 there was moderate influenza-like illness intensity with regional occurrences throughout Georgia.

- Outpatient Illness Surveillance (ILINet): The proportion of outpatient visits for ILI was 3.7%, which is above the regional baseline of 1.9%.
- **Geographic Spread of Influenza:** The geographic spread of influenza in Georgia was **REGIONAL** during week 50.
- Metro Area Hospitalizations: There were 8 hospitalizations due to influenza infection during week 50. There have been 78 hospitalizations due to influenza so far this season.
- Influenza Related Deaths: There were 0 confirmed deaths due to influenza during week 50. There have been 0 confirmed influenza-associated deaths as of 12/22/2017.
- Viral Surveillance: Of the 742 specimens tested by Georgia clinical laboratories reporting to the National Respiratory and Enteric Virus Surveillance System (NREVSS) during week 50, and 74 (10%) were positive for influenza. Public Health Laboratories tested 13 specimens during week 50, 4 specimens was positive for influenza.
- **Reported Influenza Outbreaks:** There have been 7 influenza outbreaks reported to DPH so far this season.
- RSV Viral Surveillance: Of the 474 specimens tested and reported by the Georgia Public Health Laboratory (GPHL) and the National Respiratory and Enteric Virus Surveillance System (NREVSS) collaborating laboratories during week 50, the percent positive of ALL laboratory tests was 17.8%.

Outpatient flu visits spike as more states note high activity



This graph displays the number of patients seen at sentinel provider offices and diagnosed with ILI in the past week. The data are stratified by age-group.


ILINet Provider Network Data





Georgia ILI Intensity Indicator


ILI Activity Levels (I - I0) correspond to the number of standard deviations away from the 3-year mean for the current week.





During **week 50** the weekly percentage of patients seen for ILI in Georgia Emergency Departments reporting to our syndromic surveillance system was 4.32%, relativity the same compared to the previous week (from 3.94% during week 49).

Number of Patient Visits with ILI Syndrome by Age Group




Influenza Hospitalizations in the eight county metro Atlanta area 2017-2018 (Emerging Infections Program data)

Influenza-Associated Deaths 2017-2018 Statewide (Influenzaassociated deaths are a notifiable condition in Georgia)







During **week 50** Georgia clinical laboratories reporting to NREVSS tested 742 specimens for influenza, 74 (10%) were positive. Both influenza A and B were identified.

Note: No subtyping information will be released from clinical laboratories



Public Health Laboratories tested 13 specimens for influenza during week 50. Influenza A(H3N2), influenza A(H1N1), and Influenza B were identified.

Georgia threshold of RSV season on-

set and end

RSV season onset is defined as the first week of two (2) consecutive weeks when the percent positive of **ALL** lab confirmed tests are greater than or equal to 10%. The end of RSV season is now defined as the first week of two consecutive weeks when the percent positive of **ALL** lab confirmed tests are less than 10%.
