Week 51 (December 16 — December 23, 2017) Synopsis

During week 51 there was HIGH influenza-like illness intensity with WIDESPREAD occurrences throughout Georgia.

- Outpatient Illness Surveillance (ILINet): The proportion of outpatient visits for ILI was 4.7%, which is above the regional baseline of 1.9%.
- **Geographic Spread of Influenza:** The geographic spread of influenza in Georgia was **WIDESPREAD** during week 51
- **Metro Area Hospitalizations:** There were 8 hospitalizations due to influenza infection during week 50. As of 12/20/2017 there have been 78 hospitalizations due to influenza so far this season.
- Influenza Related Deaths: There were 0 confirmed deaths due to influenza during week 51. There has been 1 confirmed influenza-associated deaths as of 1/2/2017.
- Viral Surveillance: Of the 949 specimens tested by Georgia clinical laboratories reporting to the National Respiratory and Enteric Virus Surveillance System (NREVSS) during week 51, and 126 (13.3%) were positive for influenza. Public Health Laboratories tested 8 specimens during week 51, 3 specimens was positive for influenza.
- **Reported Influenza Outbreaks:** There have been 7 influenza outbreaks reported to DPH so far this season.
- RSV Viral Surveillance: Of the 510 specimens tested and reported by the Georgia Public Health Laboratory (GPHL) and the National Respiratory and Enteric Virus Surveillance System (NREVSS) collaborating laboratories during week 51, the percent positive of ALL laboratory tests was 18.5%.



This graph displays the number of patients seen at sentinel provider offices and diagnosed with ILI in the past week. The data are stratified by age-group.


ILINet Provider Network Data



Georgia ILI Intensity Indicator


ILI Activity Levels (I - I0) correspond to the number of standard deviations away from the 3-year mean for the current week.



Syndromic Surveillance Data Daily Influenza-like Illness Syndrome (percentage of ILI visits)


Syndromic Surveillance Data Weekly Influenza-like Illness Syndrome (Number of ILI visits by Age Group)

During week 51 the weekly percentage of patients seen for ILI in Georgia Emergency Departments reporting to our syndromic surveillance system was 6.8%, relativity the same compared to the previous week (from 5.6% during week 50).

Number of Patient Visits with ILI Syndrome by Age Group




Influenza Hospitalizations in the eight county metro Atlanta area 2017-2018 (Emerging Infections Program data)

Influenza-Associated Deaths 2017-2018 Statewide (Influenzaassociated deaths are a notifiable condition in Georgia)







During **week 51** Georgia clinical laboratories reporting to NREVSS tested 949 specimens for influenza, 126 (13.3%) were positive. Both influenza A and B were identified.

Note: No subtyping information will be released from clinical laboratories



Public Health Laboratories tested 8 specimens for influenza during week 51. Influenza A (subtyping not performed) and influenza A(HINI) were identified.

Georgia threshold of RSV season on-

set and end

RSV season onset is defined as the first week of two (2) consecutive weeks when the percent positive of **ALL** lab confirmed tests are greater than or equal to 10%. The end of RSV season is now defined as the first week of two consecutive weeks

when the percent positive of **ALL** lab confirmed tests are less than 10%.
