Week 52 (Dec. 27 - Jan. 2, 2016) Synopsis

During week 52 there was low influenza activity in Georgia with sporadic occurrences of sustained flu transmission.

- Outpatient Illness Surveillance (ILINet): The proportion of outpatient visits for ILI was 1.95%, which is above the Georgia baseline of 1.6%.
- **Geographic Spread of Influenza:** The geographic spread of influenza in Georgia was **SPORADIC** during week 52.
- **Metro Area Hospitalizations:** There were 0 hospitalizations due to influenza infection during week 52. There have been 33 hospitalizations due to influenza infection so far this season.
- Influenza Related Deaths: There were 0 confirmed deaths due to influenza. There has been 1 confirmed influenza-associated death as of 1/8/2016.
- Viral Surveillance: Of the 608 specimens tested by Georgia clinical laboratories reporting to the National Respiratory and Enteric Virus Surveillance System (NREVSS) during week 52, 4 (1.64%) were positive for influenza. Georgia Public Health Laboratory (GPHL) did not report any influenza testing during week 52.
- **Reported Influenza Outbreaks:** There were **0** influenza-related outbreaks reported to public health during week 52.
- **RSV Viral Surveillance:** Of the **447** specimens tested and reported by the Georgia Public Health Laboratory (GPHL) and the National Respiratory and Enteric Virus Surveillance System (NREVSS) collaborating laboratories during week 52, the percent positive of **ALL** laboratory tests was 32.21%.



This graph displays the number of patients seen at sentinel provider offices and diagnosed with ILI in the past week. The data are stratified by age-group.


ILINet Provider Network Data



(This graph reflects geographic dispersion and is not an indicator of influenza severity)


Georgia ILI Intensity Indicator

OR


ILI activity has not increased and a lab confirmed influenza outbreak in one institution.

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
Syndromic Surveillance Data Daily Influenza-like Illness Syndrome (percentage of ILI visits)


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






Georgia Virologic Surveillance Data



During **week 52** Georgia clinical laboratories reporting to NREVSS tested 608 specimens for influenza, 10 (1.69%) were positive. The predominate strain identified was influenza B.

Note: No subtyping information will be released from clinical laboratories



Georgia Public Health Laboratory (GPHL) did not report any influenza testing during week 52.

Georgia threshold of RSV season on-

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set and end

RSV season onset is defined as the first week of two (2) consecutive weeks when the percent positive of **ALL** lab confirmed tests are greater than or equal to 10%. The end of RSV season is now defined as the first week of two consecutive weeks when the percent positive of **ALL** lab confirmed tests are less than 10%.
