What is WTRS?

DBHDD contracts with providers in all six regions to provide various levels of treatment services for women with substance use disorders. The Women's Treatment and Recovery Services (WTRS) view recovery as an ongoing process to improve health and wellness and live satisfying self-directed lives for women. Providers utilize evidenced based practices that address risk factors for relapse and empower individuals to achieve identified goals with a flexible range of options for treatment.

WTRS helps to identify barriers to employment, education, housing, family roles and responsibilities, and to identify unique strengths, preferences, and natural supports in the community. Our target population is women with substance use disorders who are pregnant and/or parenting children under the age of 13 years, but also includes all eligible women.

With levels of care ranging from outpatient, residential, and transi-tional housing options, WTRS providers work with individuals who are at high risk for relapse, are pregnant, have Child Protective Services or Family Support Involvement, criminal justice involvement, psychiatric disorders, and are sufficiently medically stable to participate in treatment.

WTRS HAS PRIORITY ADMISSION FOR PREGNANT WOMEN WITH PLACEMENT WITHIN 48 HOURS. PLEASE CONTACT IMMEDIATELY IF YOU ARE PREGNANT AND NEED HELP

Questions and Answers:

- Q. Can my child(ren) stay with me while in residential treatment?**
A. Yes, Children 13 years of age or younger are allowed to stay with the mother while in residential treatment.
- Q. Are there any services for my child(ren)?**
A. Yes, Therapeutic Child Care is available in most locations as well as resources
- Q. Is there a cost associated with these services?**
A. All treatment services and housing are provided through state and federal funding.
- Q. When preparing for my initial appointment what should I bring?**
A. Proof of Identification including: Birth Certificate, Social Security Card, and Picture ID.
- Q. Can I attend a Women's Treatment and Recovery Support Program if I was recently released from prison or jail?**
A. Yes, WTRS services are available for all eligible women
- Q. What is the average length of stay?**
A. The average length of stay is three to six months.
- Q. How do I enroll in treatment services?**
