1. What are the most important factors you consider when planning where and when your organization will perform HIV testing?
2. Please list and describe any specific information/sources that you currently use when making your HIV testing plans.
3. Are there specific data that you would like to have to better inform the decision of where and when to perform HIV testing? Please describe these data and indicate how you would use the data if you had access to them.
4. What do you feel are the most important measures of how successful your HIV testing efforts are?
5. Please list the avenues by which you communicate/coordinate with other organizations that also perform HIV testing while you are making decisions about where to test (i.e., conference calls, formal discussions about specific activities or general strategies, etc.)
6. If you do not generally communicate with other groups around testing planning, please describe any barriers that may exist to limit these communications and why.
7. Is there information that you would like from other HIV testing partners that would inform your decisions of where to test? If yes, please describe the information needed and how you would use it.
8. What would you like to see in a map? OR what kind of information depicted in a map would be useful in your work? (i.e., frequencies, rates/prevalence, information by zip code, information by census tract, etc.)
