Graduation Requirements

Graduation from the dietetic internship program is expected by the end of the 54-week program with successful completion and documentation of Intern Learning Outcomes and Competencies. If the intern is not able to complete the program in this time due to an authorized reason, the internship may be extended to a maximum of 18 months.

For completion of the program, interns must meet the following requirements:

Complete a minimum of 1200 hours of planned supervised practice hours.
 Complete didactic learning experiences.
 Obtain a satisfactory rating on all rotations and examinations.
 Submit documentation for all Core Competencies for the Registered Dietitian Nutritionist (CRDN) for each rotation to the preceptor(s) and the Dietetic Internship Program Director at the end of each rotation.
 Submit all required time logs, evaluation forms, self-assessments and other required documents by the assigned due dates.
 Demonstrate no misconduct, academic or non-academic, and perform ethically in accordance with the values of the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics.
