



Georgia MMP Fact Sheet, 2010



What is the Medical Monitoring Project (MMP)?

- MMP is an ongoing population-based surveillance system to assess clinical outcomes and behaviors of HIV-infected adults receiving care in the U.S.
- MMP is currently conducted in 17 states and 6 cities by local and state public health departments in collaboration with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).
- Data are collected through randomly-selected patient interviews and medical chart abstractions (MRA).

What kinds of data are collected and how might this be of interest to my practice?

The following provide a few examples of the data collected from the 2010 MMP in Georgia:





